All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, 'Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge!' But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. But you, Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them, for I have committed my cause to you. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men.

R. Lord, in your great love, answer me.

SECOND READING ROMANS 5:12-15

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

GOSPEL MATTHEW 10:26-33

Jesus said to the Twelve: "Fear no one.

Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father.

But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

REFLECTION FOR 21st JUNE

Throughout his preaching Jesus leaves his disciples in no doubt that the mission he has entrusted to them (and us) is a daunting undertaking in the exercise of which they will face opposition, persecution and even death. In today's excerpt from the Sermon on the Mount, Matthew records Jesus 'instructions on how they are to behave in carrying out this mission. He repeatedly tells them that, in witnessing to the truth, they must not succumb to the fear that paralyses. God will be with them always – an assurance that echoes the Lord's comforting words to their suffering forebears during their exile in Babylon: 'Do not be afraid; for I am with you' (Is 43: 5). God will be with us too in all the events of daily life. It was a wise person who said with reference to God's providential intervention in our lives: 'I know not what the future holds; but I do know who holds the future.' The great French Dominican, preacher, Henri-Dominique Lacordaire (1802-61), expressed a similar insight in these words: 'What I know about tomorrow is that providence will be up before the sun.' With the Psalmist we pray: 'Our help is in the name of The Lord, who made heaven and earth' (Ps 124:8).

FEAST: 24 JUNE - THE NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST: is one of the oldest feasts celebrated in the Church and is the only birthday other than Jesus and the Blessed Virgin Mother, which has a dedicated feast day attributed to it. St John the Baptist is also known as the forerunner, precursor or harbinger as his ministry was to announce to the world the coming of Christ and always pointed people to Jesus. He did so, even from his mother's womb when he 'leaped' for joy at the arrival of Mary and Child.
