

Reflection 23.7.2023 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I was a child, I remember seeing a tree in our garden being slowly overtaken by a parasitic plant. The plant looked beautiful and luscious, almost like a tree itself, but over time it started to choke the tree. Removing it was a big operation. In our Gospel today, Jesus uses similar imagery to reflect on the situation of the world and the reality of living a life of faith. Darnel and wheat look very similar until the ear appears. While the servants in the reading are ready to remove the darnel, the owner is wary they may pull out the wheat as well, and so instructs them to let them grow together. Our life is full of wheat and weeds — beautiful acts and experiences of faith and love, and challenging, painful experiences of resentment, violence and hurt. The challenge is accepting that the two will exist together, while we hold on to our life of faith, trusting in the nearness of God and his Spirit. What are the wheat and weeds in my life? How do I care for them? Which do I allow to grow?

World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly 23rd July 2023



Pope Francis instituted the day in 2021 to be held on the fourth Sunday in July, close to the feast of Jesus' grandparents, Sts Joachim and Anne. The Pope has chosen this year's theme 'His mercy is from age to age' (Lk 1:50), which he recalled, takes us back to joyful meeting Mary and her elderly relative Elizabeth (Lk 1:39-56) The Holy Spirit had descended upon Elizabeth, and had earlier, descended upon Mary, prompting her to respond with the Magnificat, in which she proclaimed that the Lord's mercy is from generation to generation. The message from the Holy Father connects to the celebration of World Youth Day in August.

His message encourages us to create bonds between the young and the older.



First Reading Wisdom 12:13, 16-19

There is no god, other than you, who cares for everything, to whom you might have to prove that you never judged unjustly. Your justice has its source in strength, your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all. You show your strength when your sovereign power is questioned and you expose the insolence of those who know it; but, disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there.

By acting thus you have taught a lesson to your people how the virtuous man must be kindly to his fellow men, and you have given your sons the good hope that after sin you will grant repentance.

Gospel Matthew 13:24-30

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."
