

SUNDAY MASS 24 JANUARY 2021 THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING JONAH 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 24:4-9

R. Teach me your ways, O Lord.

SECOND READING 1 CORINTHIANS 7:29-31

Brothers: our time is growing short. Those who have wives should live as though they had none, and those who mourn should live as though they had nothing to mourn for; those who are enjoying life should live as though there were nothing to laugh about; those whose life is buying things should live as though they had nothing of their own; and those who have to deal with the world should not become engrossed in it. I say this because the world as we know it is passing away.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION MARK 1:15

Alleluia, alleluia! The kingdom of God is near: believe the Good News! Alleluia! GOSPEL MARK 1:14-20

After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'

As he was walking along by the Sea of Galilee he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net in the lake - for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you into fishers of men.' And at once they left their nets and followed him.

Going on a little further, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they too were in their boat, mending their nets, he called them at once, and, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the men he employed, they went after him.

REFLECTION 24th January 2021

A fisherman's life demands hard work and strength of character; it requires courage, firmness, and patience. It comes as no surprise, then, that Jesus should call strong, brave, and highly spirited fishermen of the Sea of Galilee for the work of being 'fishers of men'. Both fishermen and 'fishers of men' must work in teams. Fishing with a dragnet requires the concerted efforts of a crew of one boat or even two boats. Likewise, Jesus' followers must learn how to work together so they are sent on mission in pairs (Luke 10:1).

Both fishing and preaching the word of God entail patience and perseverance. The ordinary fisherman cannot determine where the fish are and when they will come near. Preachers cannot afford to give up either. They must believe that success will come in God's time.

The fisherman must have courage to go out into the sea despite the threat of a storm that is always there. The preacher must contend with persecution, cynicism, and skepticism: the apostles will die for the faith they proclaim.

Today is *Sunday of the Word of God*. According to Pope Francis, it is 'a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people'. The Holy Father suggests that 'a day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers.'

The community of God's people is called to venture into the deep to proclaim God's Word and catch people for the Kingdom.
