Reflection 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time Reproduced from God's Word 2022: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

Today's readings highlight for us that however we define prayer, it is ultimately about relationship. They show us an uncompromising level of intimacy with God. Abraham dares to bargain with God, and God in return does not hesitate to keep forgiving the people of Sodom for the sake of the just. Jesus too uses examples of great human intimacy, asking help from a friend in the middle of the night, and a little boy asking his Dad for food. The psalmist sums it up so well in saying: You stretch out your hand and save me ... Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me. We might ask ourselves: how intimate am I in my relationship with God? Do I willingly spend time in prayer? Do I honestly present my needs before God in prayer? Am I humble enough to call for help in my prayer? The great saint, Teresa of Avila, reminds us that 'prayer is ... nothing else than intimate sharing between friends, frequently spending time alone with the one whose love for us is beyond doubt (Life, 8). May our prayer this week be grounded in this love beyond doubt.

Stained Glass Leadlight Windows

The leadlight windows at St Cecilia's Church reflect the history of our parish.

In the newspaper report of the opening of our Church in 1908 -The front windows are filled with coloured lead lights, the other windows having "Glacier" decorations, representing religious subjects. In 1928, with the first extension to the west 'two windows to be made similar in all respects to existing windows' and in the1953/54 large extension to the east, the 7 leadlight windows cost 155 pounds and 19 shillings. Two leadlight windows for the side chapel were commissioned in 1998 and lastly, the three large windows at the back of the church in the 2000's.

14 windows, (12 lower and 2 upper ones) require one or more of the following restoration actions—bowing, with some glass already popping; glass, with cracks both small and large; glazings bars, which keep the window ridged and in place, missing from 2 windows and all others, rusted.

The restoration process is very lengthy. Firstly, the window and frame are removed and taken from the site. A rubbing of each window, to be used as a pattern when rebuilding, is taken. The window is then taken apart, the glass soaked to clean, broken pieces recut, panel is re leaded, soldered and cemented. The lead is then polished, and copper ties are soldered to the joints to reattach the glazing bars.

The glazier reinstalls the window into the frame and it is puttied in. New steel bars are cut, sprayed black, and attached to the panels within the frames, using the copper ties. Frames are then returned to be reinstalled at the Church.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD Reproduced from Liturgia

FIRST READING GENESIS 18:20-32

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'

Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?' 'No,' he replied, 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five just men there.' Again Abraham said to him, 'Perhaps there will be only forty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'for the sake of the forty.'

Abraham said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry, but give me leave to speak: perhaps there will only be thirty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'if I find thirty there.' He said, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this, but perhaps there will only be twenty there.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the twenty.' He said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more: perhaps there will only be ten.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the ten.'

You have been buried with Christ, when you were baptised; and by baptism, too, you have been raised up with him through your belief in the power of God who raised him from the dead. GOSPEL LUKE 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test.""

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it to him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants. 'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. what father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

Members of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia met for a final session last weekend to bring to a conclusion the second general assembly, held across six days in Sydney.

In addition to celebrating the final Mass on Saturday morning, Members also approved a concluding statement, reflecting on the discernment that took place during their week together.

The statement said there had been an "expression of synodality that Pope Francis has identified as a key dimension of the Church's life in the third millennium".

While some moments during the week had been "calm and harmonious", the statement also acknowledged there were times that were "tense and difficult", however "every moment has been blessed, the entire week has been grace-filled, though never a cheap grace. The Holy Spirit has been both comforter and disrupter".

Attending the Council with Bishop Anthony Randazzo were the Vicar General of the Diocese, Very Rev Dr David Ranson; Chancellor Kelly Paget; Diocesan Director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Alison Newell; Director, Catholic Schools Broken Bay, Danny Casey and Hornsby Cathedral parishioner, Raj Rajasingham. Bishop Anthony said after the closing Mass while there were tense and challenging times, the Holy Spirt was very much alive in the room during the Council and there was great energy.

Danny Casey said; "The Plenary was called to strengthen the faith life in Australia and to find new ways of bringing all closer to Christ. This must remain our focus.

The journey has been a memorable experience with good discussion among those who love the Church." He said all new proposals need to be assessed against the main purpose – bringing people closer to God and His Church.

After nearly four and a half years in preparation, on Saturday morning Council Members confirmed the decrees of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia, which were then signed by all bishops present. After the November meeting of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, the decrees will be sent to the Holy See.
