REFLECTION— Today, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. We also celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit into our hearts at our Baptism and Confirmation. We have all received the Holy Spirit. As St Paul teaches in today's second reading, in the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as free, and the one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

In that reading St Paul goes on to say that there is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit. In other words, everyone receives the Holy Spirit but not everyone receives the same gifts from the Spirit. We each receive different gifts to help build up the body of Christ. In that we are like the human body which is made up of many different parts all working for the good of the whole body. The eyes see, the ears hear, the arms carry, the feet walk, the nose smells, and so on. Likewise, in the Christian community—the Body of Christ—we need different members with different gifts.

So to each of us is given a particular manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. The gifts of the Holy Spirit should never be seen as a personal possession, or as a source of boasting or pride. They are given for the building up of the body of Christ. What gifts of the Holy Spirit do you have that you contribute to the whole?

Pentecost Sunday—is a major Catholic solemnity celebrated 50 days after Easter. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the Virgin Mary in Jerusalem. Recognized as the "**birthday of the Church**," this event marked the beginning of public ministry and the first mass conversions.

•**The Birthday of the Church:** It marks the day the Holy Spirit empowered the apostles to preach the Gospel globally, resulting in the baptism of about 3,000 people on that very day.

•**Connection to Jewish Roots:** The Christian Pentecost is tied to the Jewish festival of *Shavuot* (or the "Feast of Weeks"), which falls 50 days after Passover and celebrates the harvest and the giving of the Law to Moses on Mt. Sinai.

•**Liturgical Colour:** Priests wear **red vestments** to symbolize the burning fire of God's love and the "tongues of fire" that rested on the Apostles' heads.

COMMUNION BLESSING

- You can still receive a blessing if you are not Catholic, have not yet received your Sacrament of First Eucharist/Holy Communion, or, if you are Catholic but are not in a state of grace.

To receive a blessing instead of communion during a Catholic Mass, simply approach the priest during the distribution of communion with your arms folded across your chest, and the priest will offer a blessing.

- Please remember if you are receiving communion, the consecrated host must enter your mouth to be consumed before returning to your seat.**

UNABLE TO STAND IN LINE FOR COMMUNION? USE THE YELLOW BAND!

Please use the yellow bands located at the back of the Church (in a tub underneath the bulletin shelf) to indicate that you cannot stand in line to receive the Eucharist, by slipping it onto the side of the pew where you will be seated.

Our Priest or Eucharistic Minister will see this and will tend to you at the end of Communion.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD**First Reading Acts 2:1-11**

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Two new dioceses approved

A proposal, carefully designed and thoroughly considered to provide more effective pastoral care for the people, has been approved by Pope John Paul II, creating two new dioceses within the archdiocese of Sydney.

This is one of the most significant developments in the Archdiocese of Sydney since the appointment of its first Archbishop in 1842. It means that Sydney's one million Catholics are now located throughout the three dioceses.

The two new dioceses are:

• **BROKEN BAY**, which, in general terms, largely encompasses what was formerly the Northern Region, and which will now also include the Carlingford Parish.

• **PARRAMATTA**, which, again in general terms, encompasses the area previously identified as the Outer Western Region and which will now also include the parishes of Dundas Valley, East Gran-

ville, Granville, Harris Park, North Parramatta and Parramatta.

The new Bishop of Broken Bay is the Most Reverend Patrick Laurence Murphy, D.D., formerly Auxiliary Bishop of Sydney and Bishop for the Northern Region.
