REFLECTION—3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

At the onset of his mission, Jesus calls his first set of disciples. Nothing had prepared Andrew, Simon, James and John for the task of becoming 'fishers of men.' Their training was to catch fish and trade their catch with fish vendors. But they let themselves be won over by Jesus' magnetic presence. They leave behind their boats, their father Zebedee (in the case of James and John), and follow Jesus in the adventure of preaching the Good News of the Kingdom. At times they would be slow in understanding what the Kingdom of heaven entails. But Jesus is a patient teacher, and he teaches through unforgettable stories called parables. Most of all, he teaches by example: being merciful and caring to the least and the last.

Speaking of the call of the first disciples, Pope Francis shares: 'There are different ways of carrying out the plan that God has for each of us, which is always a plan of love. ... And the greatest joy for every believer is to respond to this call, to offer all at the service of God and their brothers and sisters.' Where do you feel the Lord is calling you at this stage of your life? Do you have the openness of the first disciples of Jesus?

Vox Populi—21 January 2026

One of the most influential figures in Catholic theology and Western philosophy is Saint Thomas Aquinas, a Doctor of the Church.

A proponent of natural theology, his school of thought, which encompassed both theology and philosophy, became known as Thomism.

His most famous work, Summa Theologica was actually an unfinished work, although it has become one of the most influential works of Western literature despite this.

At the heart of his rigorous and thoughtful theology, was a desire to know God more deeply and enter into a loving relationship with Him.

Pope Benedict XVI expressed it best in 2010 saying: "The depth of St Thomas Aquinas' thought let us never forget it flows from his living faith and fervent piety, which he expressed in inspired prayers such as this one in which he asks God:

'Grant me, O Lord my God, a mind to know you, a heart to seek you, wisdom to find you, conduct pleasing to you, faithful perseverance in waiting for you, and a hope of finally embracing you'."

He is considered one of the greatest theologians and philosophers in the history of the Church.

God has given us each charisms and gifts, providing our own unique paths to enter into a relationship with Him and understand Him more.

May St Thomas Aquinas be a guide for all those who endeavour to understand God more and to help us understand the Mystery of our faith.

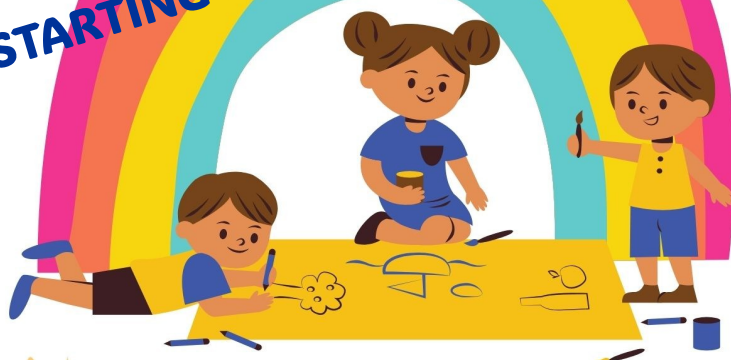

COMMUNION BLESSING

You can still receive a blessing if you are not Catholic, have not yet received your Sacrament of First Eucharist/Holy Communion, or, if you are Catholic but are not in a state of grace.

To receive a blessing instead of communion during a Catholic Mass, simply approach the priest during the distribution of communion with your arms folded across your chest, and the priest will offer a blessing.

Please remember if you are receiving communion, the consecrated host must enter your mouth to be consumed before returning to your seat.



UNABLE TO STAND IN LINE FOR COMMUNION? USE THE YELLOW BAND!

Please use the yellow bands located at the back of the Church (in a tub underneath the bulletin shelf) to indicate that you cannot stand in line to receive the Eucharist, by slipping it onto the side of the pew where you will be seated.

Our Priest or Eucharistic Minister will see this and will tend to you at the end of Communion.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading - Isaiah 8:23 - 9:3

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

In days past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in days to come he will confer glory on the Way of the Sea on the far side of Jordan, province of the nations.

The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase; they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils.

For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollo', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul?

For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned.

From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand'.

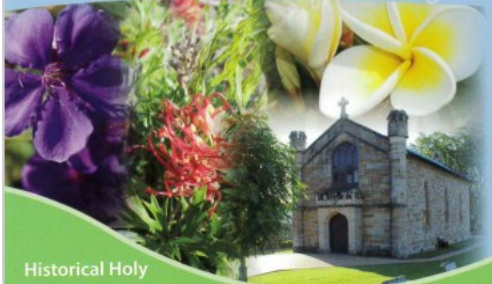
The labyrinth is a place for prayer, meditation, spiritual healing, and sometimes revelation.

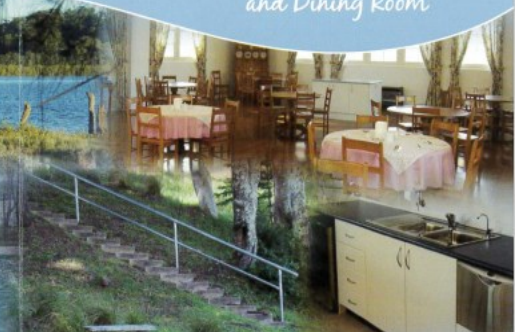
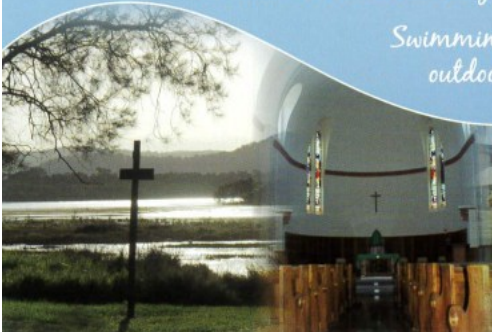

Do you have a problem that you can't solve on your own?

FOR FEMALE MIGRANTS UNDER A TEMPORARY VISA

Migrants are especially vulnerable to abuse because they are in unfamiliar territory without knowledge of the laws and emergency services they can access.

If you are experiencing domestic violence, you can take out an Apprehended Violence Order (AVO) against your partner.

Under the Migration Act you can apply for permanent residency due to domestic violence.
