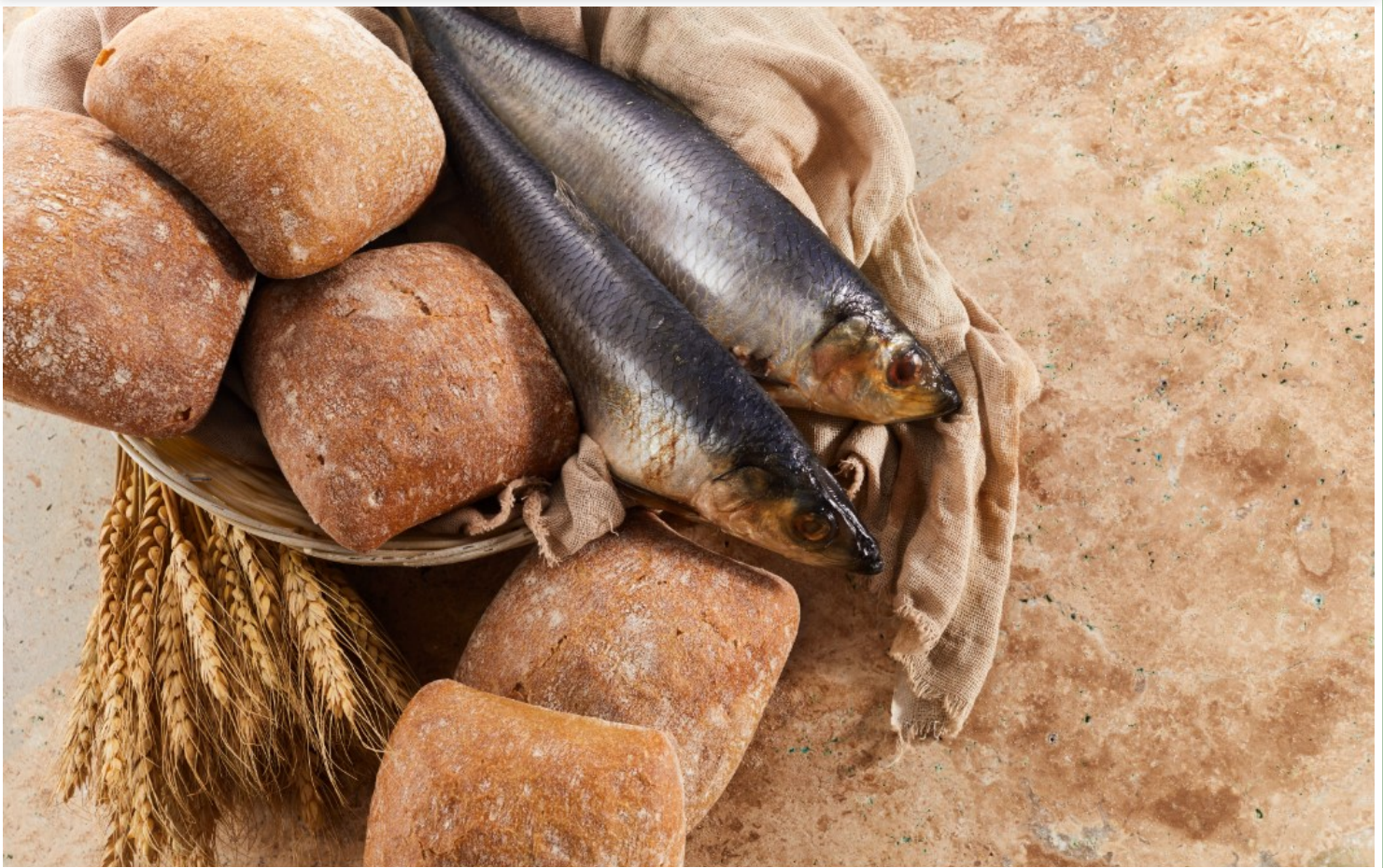

REFLECTION—18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The overabundance of God's unconditional love and God's desire to satisfy our deepest hunger are the threads running through today's readings. The passage from Second Isaiah reassures the people that God has seen their suffering and is lavishly reversing the terrible circumstances of Israel's exile. The invitation to God's generous, freely given banquet reminds Israel that nothing can satisfy their yearning more than renewing their relationship with God.

Following the death of John the Baptist, Jesus looks for some time alone. However, the crowds seek him out, hungry for healing, both physical and spiritual. Jesus recognises their yearning and is filled with compassion, and sets about providing for them the type of abundant divine hospitality that we heard about in Isaiah. Yet Jesus' disciples are initially reluctant to bear responsibility for the crowd's hunger, preferring to send them away. Jesus wants his disciples to experience his same compassion for the people and, by turning towards the Father and blessing the loaves and fish, shows them that the abundance of God's love will be poured out through them.

Indeed, such is God's love for us that, as St Paul reminds us in the letter to the Romans nothing, absolutely no circumstance, nothing in existence, can separate us from God's love. This is our hope. Look at our God, who desires to satisfy my need! But am I even aware that what I hunger after is God?

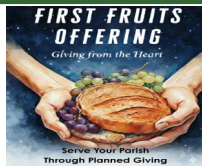

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

IDENTIFYING AS CATHOLICS IN THE 2026 CENSUS

As you may be aware, Australia will undertake the national Census this August. This important event provides an opportunity for every person to be counted and for our communities to be better understood and served.

In recent years, some groups have encouraged Australians to identify with a religion only if they are actively practicing, suggesting that those who are less engaged should instead select "No Religion."

As Catholics, we know that the journey of faith is often personal and, at times, complex. While our practice of the faith may vary throughout different seasons of life, many people continue to identify as Catholic because it remains a fundamental part of who they are. Research consistently shows that many Australians who may not attend Mass regularly still regard their Catholic faith as an important part of their identity.

For this reason, I encourage you, when completing your Census, to identify your religion as Catholic if you feel this reflects your faith and identity.

Selecting "Catholic" in the Census is more than a statistical exercise. It helps ensure that the presence and needs of the Catholic community are recognised within Australian society. Census information is used by governments, researchers and community organisations to:

- Plan schools, hospitals and community services;
- Inform the allocation of resources and funding; and
- Better understand the spiritual, cultural and social life of our nation.

An accurate picture of the Catholic community strengthens the Church's ability to advocate for the needs of our people and to continue serving communities across Australia.

Every person who identifies as Catholic helps tell the story of the Church's continuing presence and mission in Australia. Your response contributes to a clearer understanding of the Catholic community, enabling the Church to better serve those in need, support families, educate future generations, and continue proclaiming the hope of the Gospel with confidence.

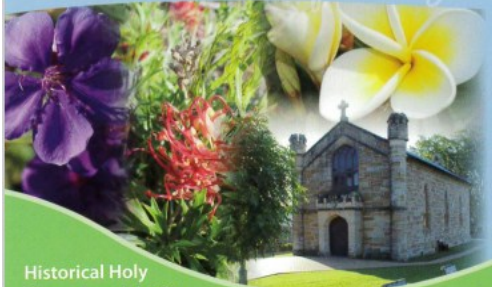
The labyrinth is a place for prayer, meditation, spiritual healing, and sometimes revelation.

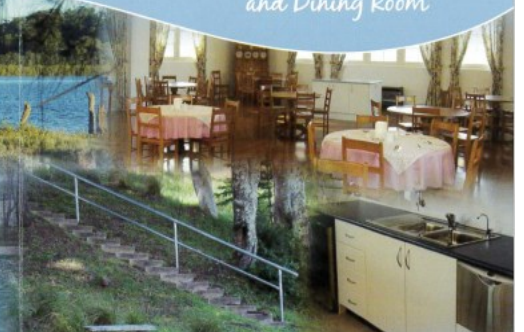
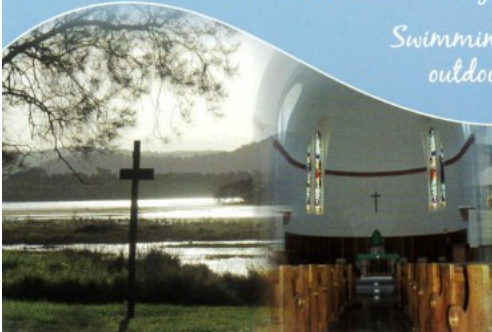
