Feast of The Presentation of the Lord Year A 2nd February 2020

The readings for this feast day, while acknowledging the reality of the human condition, are full of promise, expectation, hope and joy. The prophet Malachi proclaims that 'The Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple!'. The Psalmist orders the ancient doors to open wide for the King of Glory, who the author of the Letter to the Hebrew reminds us is the One who shares our humanity, our flesh, our blood and our suffering.

Then Luke tells of the presentation of Jesus in the Temple with simplicity, beauty and realism, Along with many other pilgrims fulfilling the law, here are two more, carrying a child, walking up the great Temple Mount steps and entering through the Temple's ancient doors. The Holy Spirit reveals to Simeon, the obedient listener, and Anna, a favoured one of God, that this infant is their long-awaited Light of the Nations. They are overwhelmed with joy. Nevertheless, Simeon foresees this child is destined to suffer.

CELEBRATE THE WORD OF GOD

Sunday of the Word of God. Our Catholic liturgical calendar has a new celebration -Sunday of the Word of God. Pope Francis has given us this new Sunday commencing in 2020, and to be celebrated each year on the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time. Our Parish is focusing on this celebration this weekend.

The year 2020 is significant as it marks the 10th anniversary of Verbum Domini, Pope Benedict XVI's Apostolic Exhortation on 'The Word of the Lord'; and the 1,600 anniversary of St Jerome's death (30 September 420), Priest and Doctor of the Church, who is best known for translating the Bible from the Greek (Septuagint) into the Latin (Vulgate).

Pope Francis, in instituting this day, wrote a letter Aperuit Illis (AI), which seeks to remind us to receive the Scriptures "not as a human word but as what it really is, the word of God". They are not just empty words. It is the Holy Spirit that "makes human words written in human fashion become the word of God" (AI, 5) He reminds us that when we read the Scriptures, we are entering into a true dialogue, a true encounter, a participation in the great story of salvation. As well as speaking to us personally, the Scriptures speak to us communally, "for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers." (AI, 8)

We are encouraged to see this day of the Word of God as a year-long event, where we grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures. Consider taking some steps to read or study the Scriptures more this year.

How is God calling us to be a Christ-centered Church that is:-

A Jovful, Hope-filled and Servant Community

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Each day they met together in the Temple; they broke bread in their homes; they shared their food with great joy and sincerity of heart; they praised God and won the favour of all the people." (Acts 2:42-46)

This National Theme for Discernment is inspired by the voices of the People of God who expressed a yearning for the Church to be a sign of God's kingdom for all people in Australia – to be able to see the Catholic Church in action, and to recognise Jesus. There was an expression of faith-filled hope in the capacity of the Catholic community to celebrate together, to show what it is to be a follower of Christ and to be loved unconditionally by God. There was a call to contemplate the Gospel call to be a servant Church for the good of all people in Australia particularly for refugees and asylum seekers and other people who are vulnerable or at risk. Many responses called for greater sharing of the story of the good works done by so many people and organizations of the Church. Some responses expressed a hunger for strong witness of faith, especially by priests, young people and female leaders in parish and school ministries (Broken Bay Diocese)
