

REFLECTION—1st Sunday of Advent

When we see the word Advent, we probably don't connect it with another word with the same origin—ADVENTURE. Those who take up the invitation to live abundantly, which is the call at the heart of Christian faith, are embarking on an adventure. This adventure is experienced not simply in surviving daily challenges but in seeing every experience as an opportunity for growth. The circumstances that I am in, whatever they are, God allows for my maturity. If I seek greater maturity in faith then I will accept the daily ups and downs as the place where Jesus is today active in my life.

A wake-up (Advent) season is a new-year opportunity to embrace once again life in Jesus Christ as the ultimate adventure. Another way of thinking of it is that while it is true to say we have been created (past tense) by God, it is even more true to say that every day we are being created (present tense) by God, fashioned and formed by God in the circumstances which are ours today—sometimes a tender embrace, at other moments a sudden and even shocking realignment. I find joy and peace when I co-operate with God's creative action. This is the Advent adventure.



You can still receive a blessing if you are not Catholic, have not yet received your Sacrament of First Eucharist/Holy Communion, or, if you are Catholic but are not in a state of grace.

To receive a blessing instead of communion during a Catholic Mass, simply approach the priest during the distribution of communion with your arms folded across your chest, and the priest will offer a blessing.

Please remember if you are receiving communion, the consecrated host must enter your mouth to be consumed before returning to your seat.






We understand many seniors prefer to stay at home as they age. The Government's funding for Home Care Packages can help you live independently at home for longer.



Course Description

This course is a dynamic introduction to St John Paul II's groundbreaking Theology of the Body — a series of teachings from his 129 Wednesday addresses — that explore what it means to be human, made in God's image, and called to love.

Students will unpack themes like identity, freedom, gender, vocation, fall and redemption, and discover how our deepest desires can be a path to God — not a detour.

More than just head knowledge, this course invites a journey from insight to transformation — from head to heart, and into daily life.

Learning Objectives

The course is designed to:

- Explore and understand the philosophical foundation on which John Paul II built his theology of the body;
- Synthesize John Paul II's "adequate anthropology" and apply it to the Christian vocations of celibacy and marriage;
- Apply John Paul II's anthropology to a range of questions such as sexual morality, bio-ethics, gender issues, the sacramental life, and the new evangelization;
- Evaluate alternative anthropologies in comparison and contrast with John Paul II's vision of man and woman;
- Integrate the principles of John Paul II's Theology of the Body in one's own life and relationships.

This course is perfect for adults (18+) - lay, clergy, seminarians, religious, ministry leaders, parish coordinators, teachers and those who have a passion and desire to dive deeper into "the rediscovery of the meaning of the whole of existence, the meaning of life." No prerequisite is required to take this course.

FOR FEMALE MIGRANTS UNDER A TEMPORARY VISA

If you are experiencing domestic violence, you can take out an Apprehended Violence Order (AVO) against your partner.

Under the Migration Act you can apply for permanent residency due to domestic violence.
