> What is the significance of Jesus? What did he come for? In Advent we try to understand Jesus through the lens of the Gospel accounts of John the Baptist. His relationship with Jesus slowly helps us clarify who this Messiah Jesus is. The second reading takes us immediately to the heart of the Gospel: He came for the salvation of all. We await the fulfilment of this salvation: it is part of our life-long Advent. Two prophets help us on our journey. Isaiah foresees the Messiah as a king on whom the Spirit of God rests. In him, God's reign comes, and creation is itself made new. John is another Elijah, crying in the wilderness and baptizing in the Jordan river. There the people come and wash, in order to reclaim their identity with their ancestors, and their readiness to welcome the Messiah, Jesus, who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire. In your prayer, attend to this double awaiting: the coming of your Saviour, and signs of God's universal reign emerging even now in your daily life.

Sunday Mass 4 December 2022

Second Sunday of Advent, Year A

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD First Reading Isaiah 11:1-10

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse, a scion thrusts from his roots: on him the spirit of the Lord rests, a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. (The fear of the Lord is his breath.) He does not judge by appearances, he gives no verdict on hearsay, but judges the wretched with integrity, and with equity gives a verdict for the poor of the land. His word is a rod that strikes the ruthless; his sentences bring death to the wicked. Integrity is the loincloth round his waist, faithfulness the belt about his hips. The wolf lives with the lamb, the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion cub feed together with a little boy to lead them. The cow and the bear make friends, their young lie down together. The lion eats straw like the ox. The infant plays over the cobra's hole; into the viper's lair the young child puts his hand.

They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain, for the country is filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea. That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations and its home will be glorious.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 71:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17

R. Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

Second Reading Romans 15:4-9

Everything that was written long ago in the scriptures was meant to teach us something about hope from the examples scripture gives of how people who did not give up were helped by God. And may he who helps us when we refuse to give up, help you all to be tolerant with each other, following the example of Christ Jesus, so that united in mind and voice you may give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It can only be to God's glory, then, for you to treat each other in the same friendly way as Christ treated you. The reason Christ became the servant of circumcised Jews was not only so that God could faithfully carry out the promises made to the patriarchs, it was also to get the pagans to give glory to God for his mercy, as scripture says in one place: For this I shall praise you among the pagans and sing your name.

Gospel Acclamation Luke 3:4, 6

Alleluia, alleluia!

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

Gospel Matthew 3:1-12

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' This was the man the prophet spoke of when he said: A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But when he saw a number of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.'

Vox Populi - Voice of the People 30 November 2022

The first week of Advent is coming to a close and we will soon light our second purple or violet coloured candle which symbolises Faith.

It is sometimes called the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

This week allows us to reflect on a life lived in the spirit of trust.

Bethlehem is a story about a humble couple on an unwanted journey, at an inconvenient time, to visit a tiny insignificant town.

Augustus Caesar was ruling, and he called for a census to be taken, but God was in charge, and He used Caesar's edict to move Mary and Joseph eighty miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem to fulfil His Word.

When the angel Gabriel visited Mary saying she would bear a son who she will name Jesus, and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His Kingdom there will be no end, Mary said; "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." (Luke 1:38). Certainly a sign of faith and trust, and it meant that from then on, Mary's life would be a part of the fulfilment of divine prophecy.

A woman of deep faith Mary trusted in God so completely that she cooperated with God's call, allowing Jesus to be born into the world.

The Bethlehem Candle of Faith is well named. In a world of commercialism and "happy holidays", it takes faith to embrace and celebrate the true meaning of Christmas.

Every gift makes a difference to someone in hospital, school, a parish or the wider community.


