THE LITURGY OF THE WORD Reproduced from Liturgia

FIRST READING WISDOM 9:13-18

What man can know the intentions of God? Who can divine the will of the Lord? The reasonings of mortals are unsure and our intentions unstable; for a perishable body presses down the soul, and this tent of clay weighs down the teeming mind. It is hard enough for us to work out what is on earth, laborious to know what lies within our reach; who, then, can discover what is in the heavens? As for your intention, who could have learnt it, had you not granted Wisdom and sent your holy spirit from above? Thus have the paths of those on earth been straightened and men been taught what pleases you, and saved, by Wisdom.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM PS 89:3-6, 12-14, 17

R. In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

SECOND READING PHILEMON 1: 9-10, 12-17

This is Paul writing, an old man now and, what is more, still a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for a child of mine, whose father I became while wearing these chains: I mean Onesimus. I am sending him back to you, and with him - I could say - a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION PS 118:135

Alleluia, alleluia! Let your face shine on your servant, and teach me your laws. Alleluia!

GOSPEL LUKE 14:25-33

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes, and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'

Reflection 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reproduced from God's Word 2022: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield Who can know the intentions of God?' (Wisdom 9:13). This question often arises when we cannot understand or have difficulty accepting our life experiences or situations. Sometimes, the uncertainties we face here on earth strengthen our desire to be with God for ever. At other times they raise more questions about heaven's reality. But we can take courage from God's reassurance and our experience that God has been our refuge from generation to generation (Psalm 89). Saint Paul writes his letter to Philemon from prison, having lived through many challenges and hardships. He asks Philemon to accept back the slave, Onesimus, not as a slave but as a dear brother in Christ, and with him a part of Paul's own self.

The attitude of welcoming is also fostered in the Gospel, despite the statement about hating 'mother and father' which usually shocks us when we read it. Jesus is using a kind of reverse psychology. He is stressing that our primary commitment must be to him. This will ensure that we don't have an undue attachment to others in order to meet our own needs, but that our relationships with others are welcoming, and our hearts are open for everyone.

Let us make this a priority in the upcoming week

Parish Finance update for the year ending 30 June 2022

Total income for the year is steady at \$103,287 (from 101,574 last year). Total Expenses for the year have decreased slightly to \$128,260 (from \$136,923 last year). Whilst this should have left our Parish with an operating shortfall we were fortunate to receive government assistance of \$33,222. With property inspections now due we will have to fund part of this from reserves.

As always, new Parishioners are encouraged to join our planned giving programme. Please contact the Parish office for more information. Don't forget the Broken Bay Parish Giving app allows you to set up regular contributions to our parish first and second collections without the need for physical money (eg notes & coins).

As you know inflationary increases will burden us all and the Parish is not immune. Further increases in utility costs are already coming through. Whilst I encourage you to give more if you can, the answer for our Parish lies in an increase in patronage. Please encourage your families and friends to attend Mass. Our numbers have fallen for a number of reasons however now is the time to welcome people back to our Church.


