REFLECTION 5TH DECEMBER Luke 3:1-6 Reproduced from God's Word 2021: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

Today, the Second Sunday of Advent, we meet John the Baptist. Note the details in the Gospel reading: John the Baptist 'went throughout the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance...' The word in the original Greek that is often translated as repentance is 'metanoia' literally meaning 'change of heart. One commentary adds that this kind of repentance is not about regret or guilt or shame but implies making a decision to turn around, to face a new direction. When we face away from the light, all we can see is our own shadow. When we turn towards the light our shadow and the darkness are behind us. Repentance means not only turning from what is bad, but also from many things that are good, but just not for us at this time, or turning from good things to which we have become inordinately attached and which, therefore, restrict our ability to be truly free.



Sunday Mass 5th December 2021 Year C THE LITURGY OF THE WORD *Reproduced from Liturgia*

FIRST READING BARUCH 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God.

And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.


GOSPEL ACCLAMATION LUKE 3:4, 6

GOSPEL LUKE 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert.John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Inaugural Red Wednesday Mass

The Diocese of Broken Bay's inaugural Red Wednesday Mass took place on 24 November at Our Lady of Dolours, Chatswood, with presider Fr David Ranson. Many of the faithful in attendance wore red, standing with those around the world for whom Mass attendance is not possible, as well as those who are actively persecuted or who have lost their lives for their Christian beliefs.

The beautifully decorated sanctuary immediately drew one's attention upon entering the church. Red lighting complemented by red banners and flowers created a powerful focus for the liturgy. The shining of red light on the carved image of Jesus behind the altar highlighted the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. Jesus himself died a tragic death, and the sacrificial aspect of the Eucharist came to the fore in this celebration of the Mass where we remembered all others who have followed Him, and who have stayed true to the name Christian despite the terrible cost.

It was quite providential that the marking of Red Wednesday this year coincided with the Memorial of Saint Andrew Dũng-Lạc (d. 1839) and companions, who are Vietnamese martyrs from the 17th - 19th centuries. Fr David referred to their martyrdom is his homily, as well as that of the Algerian Trappist monks who died in 1996 and were of the same order as Fr David at that time. The last survivor of that attack, Father Jean-Pierre Schumacher, died just days ago on 22 November aged 97.

Red Wednesday remembers all Christians who suffer and are oppressed for their faith around the world. It is an initiative of Aid to the Church in Need, a Catholic organisation that seeks to support those in the Body of Christ who suffer persecution. Red Wednesday began in the UK in 2016 and is now marked around the world with churches and buildings bathed in red light to remember those many Christians who continue to suffer for their faith today, and those who have died in martyrdom.

Aid to the Church in Need recently released its bi-annual "Religious Freedom in the World Report", which showed that religious freedom is violated in almost one third of the world's countries (31.6 percent) where two thirds of the world's population lives.
