

REFLECTION 6th January 2022

GOSPEL LUKE 5:1-11

Reproduced from God's Word 2022: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch. When Jesus shows us the abundance he has in store for us, when we get a glimpse of the utter goodness of God, it is natural for us to respond by saying we are not worthy. We are sinners.

This was the case with Simon Peter when the Lord asked him to go out into the deep and put out his nets for a catch. A fisherman all his life, Peter told Jesus that he'd worked hard all night, but caught nothing, so what is likely to change now? But in obedience, he does was Jesus asks and catches so many fish that his nets break. Jesus meets Peter's lack with overflowing abundance and Peter is overcome by his sinfulness and unworthiness.

But what we learn here is that God's goodness doesn't depend on our worthiness. We can't earn his abundance. It just is. And having strengthened Peter by giving him this glimpse of how God provides, Jesus urges him to banish his fears and step out in faith to share the message of God's goodness with others.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD Reproduced from Liturgia

FIRST READING ISAIAH 6:1-8

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings. And they cried out one to another in this way, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said: 'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said: 'See now, this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged.'

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying: 'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?' I answered, 'Here I am, send me.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM PS 137:1-5, 7-8

R. In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord.

SECOND READING 1 CORINTHIANS 15:1-11

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you - believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

GOSPEL LUKE 5:1-11

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signalled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking.

When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

Vox Episcopi – The Voice of the Bishop 2 February 2022

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Many people have now returned to work and students are beginning a new school year. There has been much to organise to ensure a safe and smooth return to the classrooms and my thanks to all our dedicated teachers and committed staff with Catholic Schools Broken Bay who have worked assiduously for the wellbeing not only of our students and their families but all their fellow colleagues in our schools in the diocese. A great deal of work has gone on behind the scenes and I want you to know your professionalism and pastoral support is greatly appreciated.

At such a busy time it is possible to overlook the significance of the beautiful Feast of the Presentation of the Lord we celebrate today, 2 February, the fortieth day after the festival of Christmas where we welcomed the birth of the Lord.

Saint Luke tells us how Joseph and Mary took the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem in accordance with the Jewish custom of the day (Luke 2:22-40). The presentation of Jesus was also important because of the presence of Simeon and Anna.

The Evangelist Luke tells us that the Holy Spirit visited Simeon and revealed to him that he would not die until he had seen the Christ of God, and to go to the Temple that day. Simeon did so and taking Jesus in his arms recognised Him as the Lord. Anna, also elderly and a prophetess who lived in the Temple, recognised Jesus as the Messiah.

What we learn from St Luke's Gospel is the importance of being patient when it comes to God's promises. Our patience should mirror God's patience and with the many challenges that will still no doubt present to all of us this year, together, let us pray to be more patient with ourselves and each other.

I have also prepared some thoughts for you on the approaching Season of Lent which is a marvellous time of preparation for the celebration of Easter.

Ash Wednesday may seem like a little "down the track" but time spent in faithful preparation is faithfully rewarded. Lenten penance can be another good test of our patience! My full Lenten Penance for the Diocese can be found here.

While you read this edition of BBNeighbourhoods, I will be on my way to Rome. As well as being present at a Symposium on the Priesthood I will be attending several meetings in the Eternal City. There are still many restrictions and health challenges in Italy, so I humbly ask you to keep me in your prayers that I might return to you safe and well at the end of the month.

While I am away the Vicar General, Fr David Ranson, will administer the Diocese of my behalf.
