

Jesus Christ, the Alpha and the Omega - A Lenten Program for the Diocese of Broken Bay

This year, parishes of the Diocese of Broken Bay will take part in a Diocesan Lenten Program, Jesus Christ, the Alpha and the Omega. This resource invites you to prayerfully reflect on the Sunday Gospel readings in Lent together with the six priorities set before us by Bishop Anthony Randazzo in his Pastoral Letter to the community of the Church of Broken Bay, dated 29 November 2020.

For each of the 6 weeks of Lent, this resource includes a reading of the Gospel text; a reflection on the text which draws on one of Bishop Anthony's priority areas; and a personal testimony on an aspect of that particular priority area. All materials and reflections have been prepared by members from our Broken Bay Church community, making this resource relevant to us and the journey we are on as a community.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING JOB 7:1-4, 6-7

Job began to speak: Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service, his time no better than hired drudgery? Like the slave, sighing for the shade, or the workman with no thought but his wages, months of delusion I have assigned to me, nothing for my own but nights of grief.

Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be day?' Risen I think, 'How slowly evening comes!' Restlessly I fret till twilight falls. Swifter than a weaver's shuttle my days have passed, and vanished, leaving no hope behind. Remember that my life is but a breath, and that my eyes will never again see joy.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 146:1-6

R. Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.

SECOND READING 1 CORINTHIANS 9:16-19, 22-23

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this: in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me. So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. For the weak I made myself weak. I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessing.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION MATTHEW 8:17

Alleluia, alleluia! He bore our sickness, and endured our suffering. Alleluia!

GOSPEL MARK 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them. That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

REFLECTION 7th February 2021

Jesus' short life was dedicated fully to God and to the people. In the Gospel today we see him engaged in his mission of healing people, casting out demons and preaching. Despite all this activity, he did not neglect to spend time alone with the Father in prayer. Jesus had the custom of rising before dawn to go to a lonely place to pray. His communication with the Father was essential for his life and mission. His relationship with the Father was the source of his strength and courage and the only way he could constantly give of himself to others. How is your relationship with the Father? We can all say that we are too busy to pray. Perhaps today we can draw our inspiration from Jesus, and consider how we can make more time for prayer. Perhaps we can get up a bit earlier to spend some quiet time without distractions, so that we are better able to be God's presence and love in the world.

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Most Rev Anthony Randazzo Bishop of Broken Bay Message for BBNeighbourhoods 2 February 2021

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope that my first vox episcopi message for 2021 finds you well rested after a somewhat hectic year and that, notwithstanding the COVID restrictions over the Christmas and New Years periods, you have been able to connect with family, loved ones, and friends.

I am deeply grateful for the many kind messages of condolence that I received when my mother, Caterina, passed away on 29 December 2020. I found your kindness and thoughtfulness at that moment of sorrow to be most consoling. I am also grateful to our clergy who offered Masses for the repose of my mother's soul. The distress of not being able to attend my mother's funeral, which was held in Queensland where the border was closed, was lightened by the solidarity of you, the people and clergy of our Diocese. I thank God for you and pray the Lord's blessing will come to you in abundance throughout 2021.

My 2020-2021 Pastoral Letter to the Diocese, "Jesus Christ, our beginning and end," which I issued on 29 November 2020, is proving to be very well received. I have been told by priests and people from around our community of the Church that it has been thought provoking and engaging. That is what I was hoping to achieve. In some instances, groups of the faithful have gathered to read, reflect, and discuss the Pastoral Letter and then spend some time in prayer. I am delighted that it has been of use and that sisters and brothers from our community are finding creative ways to treat the Pastoral Letter.

To this end, I hope that you will appreciate the soon-to-be released Diocese of Broken Bay Lenten Program 2021 titled, "Jesus Christ, the Alpha and the Omega." I have asked Evangelisation Broken Bay (EBB) to draw upon my six priorities outlined in my Pastoral Letter and prepare a Lenten method for us to probe the mystery of faith during Lent 2021. I hope that you will find it of benefit. I am thankful to our EBB Team for their work and commitment to the project.

With COVID restrictions having been eased by the NSW Government in recent days, I have issued a COVID-19 Restrictions Update for our community of the Church. While we will have greater access and movement for various celebrations and functions in our churches and halls, I would still call upon you to exercise prudence and charity when we gather. The Government has asked that mask wearing indoors be mandatory. Please respect this Government requirement, especially in our churches when we gather for prayer and worship. Above all, let's encourage one another by showing respect and care for every member of the community, in church or beyond. I appeal to you as my sisters and brothers in Christ, and as good, responsible, and praiseworthy citizens.

May the week ahead be one of grace and peace for you and your families.
