
WE HAVE EXCITING NEWS

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Sunday Mass 7th June 2020 The Most Holy TRINITY THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING EXODUS 34:4-6, 8-9

With the two tablets of stone in his hands, Moses went up the mountain of Sinai in the early morning as the Lord had commanded him. And the Lord descended in the form of a cloud, and Moses stood with him there.

He called on the name of the Lord. The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, 'Lord, Lord, a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness.' And Moses bowed down to the ground at once and worshipped. 'If I have indeed won your favour, Lord,' he said 'let my Lord come with us, I beg. REFLECTION FOR 31ST MAY

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 'The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them' (CCC 234). It is also what distinguishes our Christian belief in the one true God from that of our Jewish and Muslim brothers and sisters. If we are not well versed in philosophy and theology, we may find it helpful to extend our reflections on the doctrine of the Trinity beyond what it reveals about the inner life of God. We can see it as a summary of what we believe about the ways in which the triune God shares the divine life with us – as creator, redeemer and sanctifier. If this doctrine is to stand at the center of our faith, truly and not just rhetorically, we must concentrate 'more on the mystery of God with us, God for us, and less on the nature of God by Godself' (Catherine Mowry LaCugna). How do I, created in the image and likeness of God (Gen 1: 26-27), experience God's presence in my daily life?
