

#### FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER GOSPEL REFLECTION JOHN 10: 27-30 8th May 2022

Imagine Paul and Barnabas standing tall, shaking the dust from their feet and moving out of the region filled with joy and the Holy Spirit. What a feat, considering they'd not been farewelled with good wishes and gifts. Rather, they were driven out by a group of jealous people, persecuting and protesting against the words they had been sharing. Paul and Barnabas demonstrate that they know the voice of God in their hearts. THE LITURGY OF THE WORD Reproduced from Liturgia

#### **FIRST READING ACTS 13:14, 43-52**

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to the synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God has given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly. 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said: I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

#### **SECOND READING REVELATION 7:9, 14-17**

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.'

#### Reflection for Vocations Sunday, 8th May 2022

Prepared by Fr Paul Durkin for Vocations Team, Diocese of Broken Bay

We gather today as the sheep who know the voice of the Good Shepherd.

I wonder, how does each of us know his voice?

Do we know his voice?

Do we take time to listen for his voice?

How do we listen for the voice of the Good Shepherd?

We live in a world where there are many voices.

Referring to his flock, Jesus says of himself: "no one can snatch them out of my hand", and of the Father "no one can snatch them out of the Father's hand."

Someone (or something) is constantly trying to snatch or grab US from the care of the shepherd. Jesus' victory has been won, but the struggle continues.

The identity of the enemy or thief in this passage is not clear.... Ideally, such is the bond between the shepherd and the sheep (who hear his voice and who know his voice) that no thief, however powerful or clever, can break that bond and steal the flock.

With St Paul, can we boldly say that nothing – sickness or temptation or the sword or persecution – will separate from the love of Christ?

We know the possibility of being stolen away from our relationship with Christ is a real one.

If we don't remain in close communion with the Shepherd, it is easy to wander away from the life of the flock, where we may be lost and in danger.

This was the constant story of the chosen people: "We had all gone astray like sheep, each going their own way" (Isaiah 53.6) says the prophet Isaiah. Are we like this also? Would we rather go "our own way" rather than follow the voice and command of the Shepherd?

Perhaps like the Prodigal Son we have rejected the Father and wandered off into a world of our own choosing, living life on our terms.

Nevertheless, every Sunday, and hopefully every day, we who are followers of Christ affirm that we seek to hear the voice of the shepherd, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

The protection of the Good Shepherd & the life of the Risen Lord, comes to us in Word and Sacrament every time we meet for the Mass.

Jesus is indeed a very different kind of shepherd. Not only does he look for pastures to feed US (his flock), but he feeds US (his flock) with himself – his body broken, and blood poured out.

And we live in the promise, that those who are nourished by him shall inherit eternal life, which is so beautifully depicted in our second reading today: those washed in the blood of the Lamb stand before the throne of God; there shall be no more huger or thirst or plague of any sort; there shall be no more sorrow; the Eternal Shepherd will lead them to springs of living water.

On this Vocations Sunday (or Good Shepherd Sunday) let us make this our clear intention: we pray that the Lord will raise up shepherds after his own heart – Priests, Deacons and Consecrated Religious who will witness by their lives and words to this Good News.

Is there someone you would encourage to consider this life? Someone you sense God may be calling? The Vocations team for Broken Bay can offer you support in this.

#### Vox Episcopi - the Voice of the Bishop 4 May 2022

This Sunday, 8 May is World Day of Prayer for Vocations – marking its 59<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday.

The motivation for this day is found in both the Gospels of Matthew (9:38) and Luke (10:2) when Jesus says "Pray the Lord of the havest to send labourers into his harvest."

There are four vocaions our Church uses to help discern God's plan: marriage, single life, priesthood and religious life and God calls us to respond freely and generously to His call.

However, World Day of Prayer for vocations is an opportunity to celebrate and pray for vocations to ordained ministry and religious life in all its forms.

In the Diocese of Broken Bay we have 7 seminarians and 3 Diaconate Aspirants. As a community we need to wrap ourselves around their formation.

Everyone in the Church has ownership of their process which is multi-dimensional – the human, spiritual, intellectual and pastoral – and they interrelative, and interconnect with each other.

In my years as a priest and bishop I have served as a vocations director, seminary rector and episcopal vicar for formation with a particular focus on the formation of seminarians, young clergy, and the ongoing formation of priests.

I know those discerning a vocation today have seen the challenges the Church has faced and the shift in culture but still they come forward. I have also heard those considering a vocation say that prayers, their own as well as others, are critical to their discernment.

Even once a decision has been made to pursue the priesthood, diaconate, missionary or religious life, the continual prayers of the faithful for the grace to persevere in holiness are appreciated and welcomed.

Please pray, on this Vocations Sunday, for our seminarians and deacons as they continue on their journey, and pray that the Lord will bless the Diocese of Broken Bay with more vocations.

Sunday is also special for all the mothers in the Diocese. I pray you and your families have a very special Mother's Day, and even if your mother cannot be with you I will pray in gratitude for all those who have given new life.
