The powerful words of Isaiah, If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech; if you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness.... ', are reflected by Paul who in fear and trembling, but relying on the Spirit and the power of God, and as a light in the darkness, preaches Jesus Christ to the Corinthians. Jesus reminds us that we have to let our light shine, so that others, on seeing our good actions, give glory to God.

Outside the walls of the Old City of Jerusalem, is Mount Zion Catholic cemetery. Here on a humble grave is the name,. Oskar Schindler. Why is this person, a member of the Nazi Party, buried here? Oskar, though a man with many faults, realized he could not stand by and see the Jewish people sent to the gas chambers without helping them, even at the risk of his own life. He is credited with saving 1,200 Jews during the Holocaust. In 1993 he and his courageous wife, Emilie, were named Righteous Among the Nations by the Israeli government. Oskar, while being aware of his own weaknesses like Paul, let his light shine before others, and helped so many affected people. Today, we give thanks to God for such people.

The replacement of the eastern end of the Church roof is now complete.

Metal Roofing Done Right was responsible for the actual roof replacement. Esy Access donated the scaffolding which was used to allow the access to the area and the erection cost of the scaffolding was covered by a parishioner's kind donation.

Broken Bay Diocese was given a large donation to be used specifically for capital works projects at parishes on the Central Coast.

Wyong Parish made an application under this grant and was given a total of \$22000 (GST incl). Other donations, fundraising and parish funds have been used to meet the remaining balance of \$6000. Thank you to all who helped in any way to the replacement cost for the roof.

These three parishioners, who despite the incredible heat last Saturday 1 February (over 40 deg), gave of their expertise, labour and time to make this necessary repair. The only cost for this was the materials used.

This new national collaboration is called CERA – Catholic Emergency Relief Australia – and will serve as a coordination point for Catholic agencies responding to natural disasters.


