REFLECTION - THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERTAL BASILICA

A community discerning the building of a new parish church or chapel might first consider the choice of site, asking where we will build. Perhaps it's helpful to ask whether the new church will be built on earth or in heaven? The question is a surprise, but a church in the Catholic tradition is understood to be a foyer or narthex of heaven. Of course, a church building is not completely in heaven, but neither is it simply another earthly shrine.

Today's feast of the Cathedral for the diocese of Rome blends the boundaries between earthly church buildings and the Church as the body of Christ: We are God's building and Jesus is our foundation. We are, each of us individually and all of us together, temples of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, when we enter a church building we are no longer simply on earth, but we are touching and tasting the heavenly realities and our eternal future.

From the Collect for today's feast we pray: O God, who from living and chosen stones prepare an eternal dwelling for your majesty, increase in your Church the spirit of grace you have bestowed, so that by new growth your faithful people may build up the heavenly Jerusalem. Amen.

Renewing Our Eucharistic Practice

In every celebration of the Mass, the moment of Holy Communion is not simply a personal devotion, it is a sacred act of communion with Christ, with the Church and with one another.

In recent years the reception of Holy Communion has become increasingly irregular. Every parishioner should refresh the reception of Holy Communion from the Bishop's Pastoral Letter titled 'The Mystery of Faith:

Encountering Jesus Christ in the Eucharist."
From the Feast of Christ the King, the faithful in Broken Bay Diocese as well as receiving the Body of Christ will once again receive the Blood of Christ from the Chalice.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion
All Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are asked to remain after each
Mass on the 8/9 November. A short training session will be held then, with a full
commissioning planned for 2026.



COMMUNION BLESSING

You can still receive a blessing if you are not Catholic, have not yet received your Sacrament of First Eucharist/Holy Communion, or, if you are Catholic but are not in a state of grace.

To receive a blessing instead of communion during a Catholic Mass, simply approach the priest during the distribution of communion with your arms folded across your chest, and the priest will offer a blessing.

Please remember if you are receiving communion, the consecrated host must enter your mouth to be consumed before returning to your seat.

DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

This commemoration replaces a Sunday in Ordinary Time because it is regarded as a Feast of the Lord. The basilica at the Lateran is one of the great churches in Rome, dedicated to Christ the Saviour in the fourth century. It is the cathedral church of Rome and it was there that the pope lived until the 14th century before he moved across to the Vatican. The inscription on the front of the building reads: Most Holy Lateran Church, of all the churches in the city and the world, the mother and the head.

This feast may seem unusual at first: why celebrate the dedication of a church building in Rome? Yet the Lateran Basilica, the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome, symbolises the unity and communion of all the local Churches gathered around the successor of Peter. When we honour this physical building, the "mother and head of all churches", we affirm the deeper mystery it represents: the living temple of God's people built of living stones.

The prophet Ezekiel's vision of water flowing from the Temple captures this beautifully. From the sanctuary, a trickle becomes a river bringing life wherever it goes. God's presence is never static or confined; it overflows into the world, renewing and healing creation. The Church, too, is called to be that river, a people through whom the grace of Christ flows outward to bring life.

St Paul reminds the Corinthians that they themselves are God's building, founded on Christ, and that the Spirit dwells within them. The true temple of God is not stone or marble but a community shaped by holiness, faith, and love. Every Christian, every parish, every Eucharistic

assembly is a visible sign of that living temple.

In the Gospel, Jesus cleanses the Temple, not to destroy it but to reveal its true purpose. "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." His own body becomes the new dwelling place of God among us. From his pierced side, as from Ezekiel's temple, flows the water of life and the Spirit poured out on the Church. Today we give thanks for every church that shelters the gathered Body of Christ. Within their walls we are formed, forgiven, and sent forth. The feast of the Lateran Basilica calls us to recognise that the holiness of the Church's buildings points to the holiness of her people, and that from our worship should flow a living stream of mercy and renewal for the world. https://www.liturgia.com.au/App/Overview

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side. He said, 'This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market'. Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up'. The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.



A maximum of 54 people can be accommodated in 35 double, twin, or single rooms, all with modern







Course Description

This course is a dynamic introduction to St John Paul II's groundbreaking Theology of the Body — a series of teachings from his 129 Wednesday addresses — that explore what it means to be human, made in God's image, and called to love.

Students will unpack themes like identity, freedom, gender, vocation, fall and redemption, and discover how our deepest desires can be a path to God — not a detour.

More than just head knowledge, this course invites a journey from insight to transformation — from head to heart, and into daily life.

Learning Objectives

The course is designed to:

- Explore and understand the philosophical foundation on which John Paul II built his theology of the body;
- Synthesize John Paul II's "adequate anthropology" and apply it to the Christian vocations of celibacy and marriage;
- Apply John Paul II's anthropology to a range of questions such as sexual morality, bio-ethics, gender issues, the sacramental life, and the new evangelization;
- Evaluate alternative anthropologies in comparison and contrast with John Paul II's vision of man and woman;
- Integrate the principles of John Paul II's Theology of the Body in one's own life and relationships.

This course is perfect for adults (18+) - lay, clergy, seminarians, religious, ministry leaders, parish coordinators, teachers and those who have a passion and desire to dive deeper into "the rediscovery of the meaning of the whole of existence, the meaning of life". No prerequisite is required to take this course.

Under the Migration Act you can apply for permanent residency due to domestic violence.


