The Readings for the Book of Daniel and the Gospel of Mark teach us of the second coming of Christ and the resurrection of the dead.

According to Daniel, the wise and the righteous will shine like stars. Jesus reminds us that the Son of Man will come in the clouds and his angels will gather the elect. Will the second coming of the Lord be imminent? Jesus is quite clear on this: "But of that day, or that hour, no one knows, not even the angels in Heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Mk 13: 32).

The Church wants to remind us of the need to remain prepared, not in worry and fear, but in the love of God and in charity and compassion towards the needy. We need to read the signs of the times. The events of everyday life, like natural calamities, accidents, epidemics, wars, terrorist attacks, economic recession, etc should lead us to think of the shortness and vulnerability of our life on earth and of our true destiny which is Heaven where we shall enjoy eternal happiness.

'Rejoice and Be Glad' Discussion Guide

The Diocese of Broken Bay Discussion Guide on *Gaudete et Exsultate* is now available on the diocesan website.

Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate* (Rejoice and Be Glad) invites every person to a path of holiness. A 5-week Discussion Guide has been prepared to encourage engagement with this document, and it would be a suitable Advent resource for small groups.

The weekly sessions correspond to the chapters within the document:

Week 1 - The call to holiness is meant for everyone, each in our own way, so that we become what God had in mind when we were created.

Week 2 - We can block our holiness when we think it is only about what we know, or when we try to do it on our own without God's grace.

Week 3 - The Beatitudes is the way we grow in holiness. It is the Christian's identity card.

Week 4 - The signs of holiness in our life are perseverance, joy, boldness, community, prayer.

Week 5 - Christian life is a battle, and we need to discern the promptings of the Holy Spirit.


