The feast of the Most Holy Trinity calls our attention to the great mystery of God. We can look up at the moon and the stars or gaze on a panorama of mountains and valleys and be filled with wonder.

Such feelings engulf the author of today's responsorial psalm. We have been given a share in God's royal authority over creation. Our God is never a hoarder of power but One who freely delegates this power to us. This psalm reminds us that praise of God does not mean leaving everything to God. We cannot spend all our time on our knees exclaiming, 'O Lord, our God, how wonderful you are!'

At the end of every Eucharist we are sent out to love and praise the Lord by caring for our fellow human beings and for all of creation. Refreshed by the liturgy, we are called to roll up our sleeves and take up our task.

"O Lord our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth".

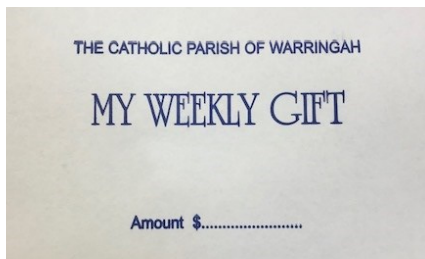

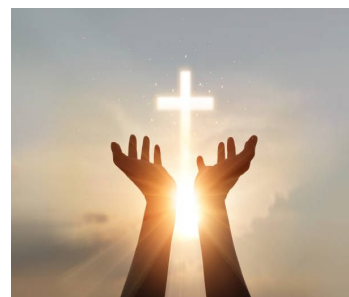
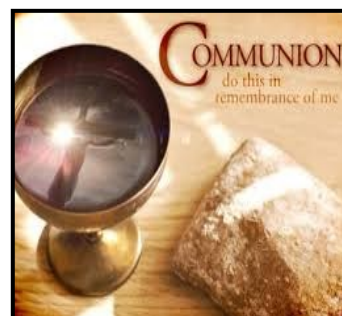
A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
