


Jesus shared our human nature in all things but sin.
Expanding this affirmation, the Epistle to the Hebrews states, that in Jesus, 'we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin'— a truth graphically illustrated in the Gospel accounts of Jesus' confrontation with Satan during the forty days he spent in the wilderness before proclaiming his mission. 'The time is fulfilled,' he said to the Galileans, 'and the kingdom is not from this world', as Jesus assured Pontius Pilate, it is 'among us' here and now. The beginning of Lent is a good time to reflect on these texts.

Pauls' advice is: 'Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God— what is good and acceptable and perfect'.

Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant.

Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
