
Catholic Mission Appeal (this weekend)

On Friday March 3rd, at 10am, parishioners are invited by St Kieran's Church, Manly Vale, to the Annual World Day of Prayer Service. In 2020, before Covid, St Kevin's hosted this celebration, and in previous years St John's, Narraweena, has been the organising church in our area. But what exactly is the World Day of Prayers?

It is an international ecumenical initiative now celebrated in 170 countries and organised by Christian laywomen of all denominations. Its motto is "informed Prayer and Prayerful Action".

Every year a country is chosen as focus, and prepares the prayres and readings. A collection is taken up for some special need in that country. This year the Christian women of Taiwan have that task.

Men of our parish are also invited. It is a chance to meet people of all denominations, and to learn about the faith and needs of a country of which we may know little.

Make no mistake about it; if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are; or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as


well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'
