As light marked the dawning of Easter faith for some women, the Gospel of John points out that when a disconsolate Mary Magdalene went to the tomb, it was 'still dark'. She opens her experience of resurrection in the darkness of unfaith. But her words to the disciples send them on their way to the empty tomb. The Beloved Disciple, the best of all disciples in the Gospel of John, enters the tomb, sees, and believes. It was not until then that the disciples were able to remember and believe the words of Scripture: Jesus' promise of resurrection on the other side of death. Easter can lead us from hard-nosed unfaith (the darkness), through doubt (running to the tomb), to belief that God will always have the last word: resurrection (he saw and believed).

'This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad'.

## SCRIPTURE READINGS

#### **Entrance Antiphon**

I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

#### **First Reading**

Acts 10:34, 37-43 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.' Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

#### Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
