Today's first reading is a perfect companion piece to the Gospel parable. Both the Pharisee and the tax collector believed in the same God, belonged to the same religion and worshipped in the same temple, yet only one went home at peace with God. Why?

The tax collector was conscious that he needed God to move forward; The Pharisee, however, seemed so self-sufficient as to merely desire God's approval.

Such a belief in God saves nobody. What really matters is how our faith in God affects our view of ourselves and of others. We behave like the God we believe in. The Pharisee believed in a discriminating God who loves good people and dislikes the bad. The tax collector trusted not in himself or in anything he had done but only in God's mercy.

In our daily prayer, do we try to impress God with our achievements, or do we humble acknowledge 'God's blessings?  
*Lord, be merciful to me, a sinner!*

### HOW DO WE PRAY? A SHORT COURSE LED BY FR GERARD MORAN, OCD.

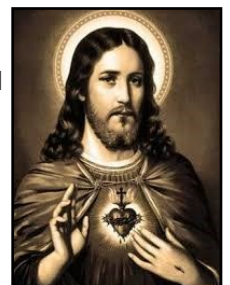


In this short course we will look at: "How we pray". We will try to address together the basic questions: What is prayer? Why pray? When do we pray? Where do we pray? With what do we pray?

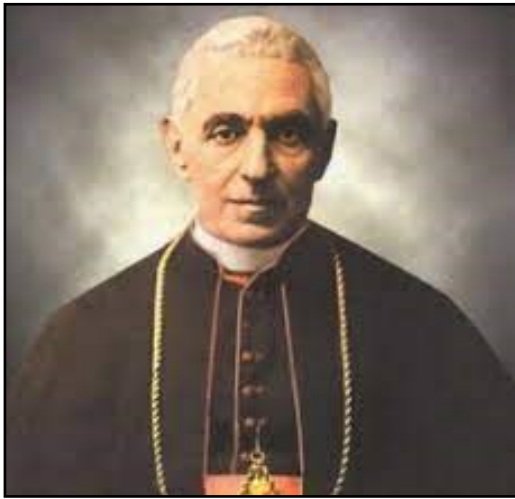

Something to think about ...

The Gospels for the past two Sundays have emphasized  
the importance of praying to God and persevering at  
prayer. This Sunday's Gospel challenges us to know the  
intentions of our hearts when we pray.

Prayer generates from our longing to know the  
heart of God. Prayer helps us discover that the deep thirst  
within us can be quenched by God only. Used throughout  
the psalms is a common image representing our spiritual  
lives: the parched earth longing for refreshing rains.  
Prayer is like rain to our spiritual lives. It brings forth new  
birth and nourishes past growth.

The Scriptures often say that it is the heart that  
prays. Therefore, when our hearts are near to God, our  
prayers are life-giving, and when our hearts are distant  
from God, it is difficult to nurture our spiritual lives through  
prayer. As Jesus lets us see the hearts of both the  
Pharisee and the tax collector in order to reveal whose  
prayer is sincere, we also need to ask Jesus to help us  
see our own hearts in truth and humility. In prayer, we  
recognize the covenantal relationship we were graced  
with in Baptism. Our hearts' desire as children of God is  
to be in communion with God the Father, God the Son,  
and God the Holy Spirit.

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves

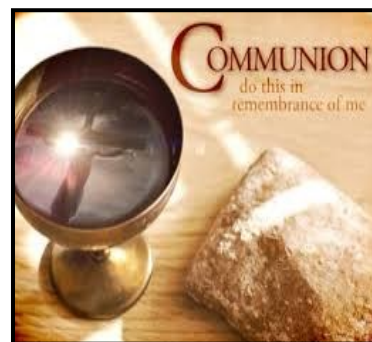
