Our State Schools in 2026

Catechists/Special Religious Educators (SRE) are being asked to teach 27 classes in 4 primary schools and Manly Selective High for our parish.



Do we have enough volunteers?

No, we need more teachers both in the primary and secondary schools.

What days are the lessons?

Tuesday or Thursday afternoons, Wed. morning <u>Student textbooks</u>? Yes - & teaching manual + USB containing all the lessons, pictures & songs.

<u>Training?</u> 8 x 2hr sessions online or face to face over one year. Time in class with another catechist.

Working with children check compulsory? Of course, but online application is easy.

How many parishioners are in this ministry?

Supportive, dedicated, loving, and busy just like you, we have about 20 dedicated catechists.


Luke 18:9-14 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.
