The call to follow Jesus is always a grace and a privilege. Jesus himself embraced the suffering and death by which he was to redeem his brothers and sisters. Luke writes: 'Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem'. Jesus had already twice prophesied that he was destined to suffer grievously, be rejected and put to death (Luke 9:22; 9: 44-45) and would do so again on the road (Luke 18:31-34) . In that context he emphasised the condition of following: " If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross every day"(Luke 9:23-26)

Today's three calls make the same demand. We are called. We are called to follow the Crucified. We are called to share his lot, to shoulder our cross daily. This comes from fidelity to Christ and his values in daily living.

"You are my inheritance, O Lord".

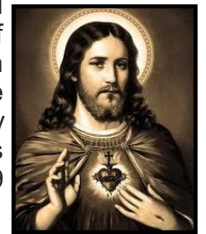

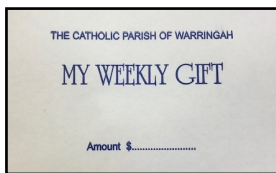

A reading from the first book of the Kings

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians

When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.

My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community.

Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.

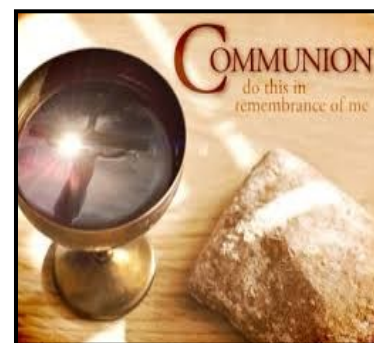
