

On the first Easter night, Jesus appears to his disciples. He blesses them with his peace, and an authority to forgive sinfulness. But Thomas is not there. A week later Jesus enters the room, and challenges Thomas' conditions. The disciple falls to his knees and confesses his faith. 'My Lord and my God'. The first disciples believed because they had physical proof of the resurrection. Those who never have had such proofs—down through the Christian centuries— are blessed in a way that exceeds the experience of the first disciples. John tells us why he wrote this Gospel for people who did not see and yet believe: that we might go believing that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and believing, have life in his name.

'Give thanks to the Lord for his is good, his love is everlasting'.



A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

I was on the island of Patmos for having preached God's word and witnessed for Jesus; it was the Lord's day and the Spirit possessed me, and I heard a voice behind me, shouting like a trumpet, 'Write down all that you see in a book.' I turned round to see who had spoken to me, and when I turned I saw seven golden lamp-stands and, surrounded by them, a figure like a Son of man, dressed in a long robe tied at the waist with a golden girdle.

When I saw him, I fell in a dead faint at his feet, but he touched me with his right hand and said, 'Do not be afraid; it is I, the First and the Last; I am the Living One. I was dead and now I am to live for ever and ever, and I hold the keys of death and of the underworld. Now write down all that you see of present happenings and things that are still to come.'

Gospel

John 20:19-31

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to

them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said. 'We have seen the Lord.' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said.
