The story of Lazarus and the Rich Man is a sobering tale of the eternal consequences of the way in which we live our life. The rich man, who in life, would not even give Lazarus the scraps from this table, finds himself in Hades, while Lazarus is embraced in the bosom of Abraham. In today's Gospel reading we hear the rich man beg not only for relief for himself in his afterlife of suffering, but also that a warning be sent to his five brothers. Abraham, however, points to all the unheeded warnings sent through history, from the prophets to Jesus himself. The time for living with compassion towards those in need is now. We cannot wait. We don't know when our time on earth will be over and we do not want to end up like the rich man, regretting our choices and paying an eternal price.

Due to the painting of the roof of the Church we would be grateful if **parishioners DO NOT PARK in the Church driveway until further notice**, to allow for heavy equipment access.



Vox Populi :25 September 2025 . On September 29, the Church celebrates the Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, three great archangels of the Bible. The three serve as mediators between God and man. For this reason, they're given names, so we may know them individually and call upon their intercession. Each of the three archangels appear in Scripture. Saint Michael appears in the Book of Daniel, then again in the Epistle of Jude. But his best known reference is in the Book of Revelation, where he is depicted fighting against the dragon (identified with Satan). This has led to depictions of Saint Michael as a warrior.

Saint Gabriel appears in the Book of Daniel too, and then later in the New Testament where he announces both the birth of John the Baptist and the birth of Jesus, to Zechariah and the Blessed Virgin, respectively. Saint Raphael appears in the Book of Tobit, where he accompanies Tobias on a long journey to bring medicine to cure his father's blindness.

While the term "saint" is normally reserved for human beings who lead exemplary and holy lives, it had traditionally been used to acknowledge those who have led a holy life.

Just like the saints in heaven, the angels can intercede for us and offer up our prayers.

In the Book of Tobit, Saint Raphael even says: "I am Raphael, one of the seven holy angels who present the prayers of the saints and enter into the presence of the glory of the Lord" (Tob 12:15). Through Michael, may we seek God's protection.

Through Gabriel, may we seek God's revelation. And through Raphael, may we seek God's healing.

Dogs even came and licked his sores.

Now the poor man died and was carried away by the angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried.

'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours."


'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham, "let them listen to them." "Ah, no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."
