

Today we begin Holy Week, the days during which we journey with Jesus on his way of the cross and anticipate his Resurrection at Easter. Today's liturgy begins with the procession with palms to remind us of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem.

Jesus acts in obedience to the Father even in death, so that sins may be forgiven. Matthew makes this clear in the story of the Lord's Supper. As Jesus blesses the chalice, he says: " . . . for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." As he moves toward his death, we cannot know the depth of his feelings. Fear? Joy? Love? Concern for others? Ultimately, his death, this enslavement, becomes liberation for all God's people and for that we stand in awe with deep gratitude.

"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?".
