Vox Populi (extract of letter from Bishop Anthony)

This Sunday we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday – the first Sunday following Pentecost. It is a solemn celebration of the belief in the revelation of one God, yet three divine persons: God the Father, the creator and sustainer of all things; God the Son, the incarnation of God as a human being, Jesus Christ, on Earth; and God the Heavenly Spirit, the power of God which is active in the world, drawing people towards God. The doctrine of the Trinity is perhaps one of the more difficult aspects of Christianity, but it is fundamental. It helps us understand the complex nature of God. The three persons of the Trinity teaches us better about the nature of God and the roles He plays. While we recognise God the Father is our Father and the Author of Life and God the Son is our Lord and Saviour, God the Holy Spirit is our Teacher and Guide and helps us understand that God is always present in the world. This is a great source of strength as we know God is always with us.

Our preparations for World Youth Day continues... only 7 weeks, 3 days, 15 hours sleeps left! We attended the formation session facilitated by the Diocese of Broken Bay, on Tuesday 16th May, at St Agatha's Parish Hall,



Pennant Hills. It was a challenge to get there on time, as we were coming from work and uni, driving across town during peak hour traffic! This experience is a timely reminder that as pilgrims, things will not always go smoothly and that there will be some bumps along the way and the best thing for us to do is to keep our cool, be there for each other and go with the flow. The session was worth it though and appropriate, given what we had just gone through to get there on time. The key topic for today's session: a pilgrim's mental well-being. It was an appropriate topic as each of us will experience emotions in different. They highlighted this point and pointed out that we will experience a wide range of emotions ranging from excitement, happiness to feelings of anxiety and stress. These emotions can be triggered by anything such as long plane trips, being away from family, forgetting stuff, losing things, sharing a space with people we don't know. 
