

Jesus descends the mountain consoled by his Father and the disciples will walk to Jerusalem with Jesus.



Reflection



He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my

Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him'. When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.


As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
