He came to the first and said, Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.' He said in reply, 'I will not, ' (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The readings today speak about conscious change. Is it possible for a person to consciously change their life, consciously change their habits and way of living? The unchanging conviction of the Bible is 'yes', conscious change is possible.

Today's Gospel offers us an interesting example of conscious and unconscious change. One son said 'yes' to his father, but did not do what his father asked. I suspect that what happened here was unconscious change. He said he would go to the vineyard, and he probably intended to, but he just didn't get around to it. The other son said 'no' but then he consciously thought about it and change his decision and went.

What massive changes the tax collectors and prostitutes must have made in their lives to follow Jesus. For many reasons, including financial, this could not have been easy, nothing short of a radical change in their way of life. But they did it. They made the change.

When we talk about conscious change, the supreme example is Jesus Christ, as St Paul notes in today's second reading: 'his state was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God by emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross; but God raised him on high'.

In our efforts to change we can take great heart from the Eucharist. In this act of worship remarkable changes happen. Not only are the bread and wine changed into the body and blood of Christ, but by our participation in the Eucharist we too are changed - together we become more fully the Body of Christ in our world.

History of Corpus Christi Parish

The formal beginnings of the Catholic Parish of St Ives were marked by the building of the first Corpus Christi Church (now the Hall) in 1953, with the foundation stone being laid on October 18th. The area was then part of the Pymble Parish and served by Priests from there. In those early years the parishioners were predominantly orchardists and market gardeners.


From as early as 1937 the Passionist College, where young men studied before joining the Passionist Community of Priests, had been a significant presence in the area.

In 1954 the Brigidine Sisters came to St Ives and began both their College and Corpus Christi School, which initially occupied the new church building during week days.

St Ives was established as a separate Parish by Cardinal Gilroy in 1958 when he appointed Fr Peter Sheil as first Parish Priest.

This year marks the 70th anniversary of our parish hall, which was our original Church at St Ives.


22 OCTOBER 2023

This community building event and fundraiser is for the presbytery build as well as celebrating 70 years as a Parish.





WE ARE KEEPING SUNDAY 5PM MASS

Thank you to everyone who has provided feedback on the 5pm Sunday Mass trial. We received 32 responses. 66% preferred to keep the 5pm Mass time, 9% preferred to revert to 6pm, and 16% suggested 5pm during Winter and 6pm during Summer. 9% did not have a preference. We acknowledge a few concerns that 5pm Mass during daylight savings might be too early and conflict with afternoon activities. There was strong feedback supporting the 5pm Mass during the cooler months.

Given the results, we will continue with 5pm Sunday night Mass from now until the end of Winter in 2024. We will monitor Mass attendance through the coming warmer months, and re-review for Spring 2024. Please contact any one of us if you would like to discuss further.

First Reading

From the prophet Ezekiel Ez 18:25-28

The sinner who decides to turn against sinfulness deserves to live.

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'You object, "What the Lord does is unjust." Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? When the upright man renounces his integrity to commit sin and dies because of this, he dies because of the evil that he himself has committed. From the letter of St Paul to the Philippians Phil 2:1-11

In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus.

If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people's interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus:

His state was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
