"Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish

Today's Gospel shows contrasting attitudes to 'impossible' situations. First there is the woman who has suffered a haemorrhage for many years. Many doctors had tried to heal her conditions but none were successful. It seemed there was no hope of a cure. But the woman thought otherwise. 'If only I can touch the hem of Jesus' cloak, I will be healed,' she believed. And indeed she was. Meanwhile the mourners in the house of Jairus, the synagogue official knowing his daughter had died, urged Jairus not to put the Master to any further

trouble. They even ridiculed Jesus when he said the daughter was not dead, only asleep. In both stories we see that in healing Jesus always encounters a person, never just an illness or a condition. This Gospel challenges us to consider our own attitude to impossible situations? Do we sometimes give up and stop praying for a particular intention deciding there is no hope, or in faith do we persevere in our prayer? Of course, true faith is essentially faith in the infinite wisdom and love of God, not faith that God will always do what we want? But let us take heart from the wise teacher in today's first reading who assures us that God takes no pleasure in the extinction of the living. God created all things including humans to have health and life in them.

- In support of the children at the Paediatric Hospital in Bangui, Central African Republic.


THE KU-RING-GAI CATENIANS CIRCLE—JUNE MEETING

The Catenian Brothers and visitors at the Circle's June meeting were privileged to hear a presentation from the Culture Project which is a group of young missionaries who have set out to restore culture through the experience of sexual integrity and virtue amongst the young. These missionaries talk to our youth in Catholic schools, public schools, pubs, universities and local community groups. The presenters at the Catenian's meeting were Francis Hopkins, Founding Director of Culture Project in Australia, plus Katherine Turnbull and Lorraine Ladias, two of the Project's very enthusiastic missionaries.

Young men and women today are struggling with deep personal and spiritual problems and many 12 and 13 year olds want to know that they are loved and possess great worth. "Just who am I?" they ask. How can suicide be the leading cause of death in the 16-24 age group when their life is just beginning and holds so much promise? Emphasis, when the missionaries are talking to youngsters, is placed on the dignity of the human purpose and the richness of living sexual integrity plus the difference between love and lust. These youngsters are encouraged to love and respect the opposite sex.

Part of what motivates the missionaries is that there is no-one "out there" sharing the message, so the message must come from youth itself. The young presenters all displayed enthusiasm, sincerity, absolute integrity and an infectious happiness during their presentation.

The Project is supported by the Bishops of Sydney, Parramatta and Broken Bay Diocese. At the conclusion of the presentation, the Circle's president, Martin Stebbings, presented a cheque and thanked the girls for coming to visit our Circle and for their commendable efforts.



Today we are celebrating Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday.
