Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, And said I do will it (<u>Gospel</u>)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

People afflicted with leprosy and similar skin diseases were regarded as untouchables in the Jewish society of Jesus' day. In keeping with the Law (see today's first reading), they had to proclaim their uncleanness publicly and keep their distance from all but they own kind.

Today's Gospel story, narrated with an economy of detail, poignantly captures the pariah status of one such unfortunate man. No onlookers are identified; there are only two characters – the leper in need of compassion and Jesus mercifully responsive to his need. In a sense, Jesus takes upon himself the uncleanliness of the leper; for in touching him he renders himself, according to the Law, ritually impure. In our own day there are classes of people who are bracketed out of society – outcasts judged harshly as inferior beings by law-abiding citizens and condemned to lead lives of conspicuous misery. Even as we stand by them in faith and love, we can make our own the leper's prayer: 'Lord, if you want to, you can cure me.'

Bio of a Catechist Jen Perrott

Who Am I?

I currently live in Newport on the Northern Beaches and work in the Parish at Corpus Christi as the Catechist Coordinator and the Pastoral Faith Formation Facilitator. I have been working in the parish since December 2014 as the Catechist Coordinator and then the role of Pastoral Faith Formation Facilitator was born in 2018. So I am currently wearing 2 hats in the parish!

Family

I remarried in 2021. I have 2 children of my own and Joe has 5 of his own. We met in 2010 and between us we have 7 children ranging from 18-28 years of age.

How long have you been a catechist? 9 Years.

What brought you to being a catechist?

I use to hear people get up and talk at Mass about the need for catechists. I always felt a desire in my heart to get involved even when I was younger, but timing was never right. I responded to an advertisement for a Catechist Coordinator at Corpus Christi after I graduated with a double degree in 2014 (Bachelor of Theology/Social Work). I remember saying to God, "Ok God, what next? You called me into this degree now what do you want me to do with it?" The very next week I saw the advertisement for a catechist coordinator at Corpus Christi. I often say, "God has a sense of humour putting me here!" but in all honestly it has been the best 9 years and I love what I do.

Why do you stay?

What brought me to the ministry is different to why I stay. It really is true that God uses the most unlikely people to do his work. Being a catechist has been one of the most rewarding experiences, knowing that you have been instrumental in the formation of a child's life and are responsible for helping that child grow in his/her friendship with Jesus. Jesus calls us to respond to The Great Commission, where He commands us to "Go and make disciples." It is important for me to strive to be the best disciple I can be and bring as many people with me as I can. We all know the rewards are eternal. Today, children are less formed in their faith than say even 20 years ago. If I can help be a small instrument in improving the formation for that child, just by planting a seed that may one day germinate into a beautiful friendship with Jesus, then that is what makes me stay.

What would you say to someone considering being a catechist?

Honestly, if you have ever felt like you should do it, or you feel an urge to respond to the need for catechists. Don't delay. The rewards for both yourself and the student are so worth it. All training and resources are provided. New people always go in as a helper and if they want to do more, they can if and when they are ready. So, speak to any of the catechists this weekend after the 10am Mass. We would love for new people to join us. From the book of Leviticus Lv 13:1-2. 44-46

As long as he is unclean, he must live alone, outside the camp.

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean". As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'

The leprosy left him and he was cured.

'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.
