Dear Parishioners

Our readings this Sunday are a handbook for learning about God.

We read the words which, in the different contexts of the Old and New Testament stories, seem to say the same things: God is merciful! Our reflection starts with a very well known story about the people of Israel. Their action in replacing the Covenant of Love with worship of a golden calf shows both human weaknesses and the endless patience of God. Despite the chosen people disappointing their leader, Moses, by offending God, God is patient and does not bring on them any punishment. Similarly, what we learn in the responsorial psalm is that God is kind and forgiving. He can purify our hearts and make them his own again. There is even more reassurance about the extent of God's forgiveness for us, who have been sinners, in the letter of Saint Paul to Timothy. The parables in today's Gospel also highlight the mercy of God who searches for all who are lost until they are found. The focus in this story is not how they came to be lost but on God who celebrates their return and shows even more clearly that his love is unconditional and endless. What if the focus in our week to come will be to mirror in some small way God's attitude? What if, this week, we try to find something good in every person we meet, despite our natural reaction to their wrongdoings? What if, this week, we try to be a little more merciful to ourselves? What if...?




Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults 2022/23

CORPUS CHRISTI PARISH REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2022

Dear Parishioners

As with the previous year this year to June 2022 has been another challenging one for our priests, our parish and our parishioners. We are grateful for the wonderful support of our parishioners, many of whom work behind the scenes to assist with the day to day running of the parish. We are also grateful to our office staff who work hard to provide the support services needed to keep the parish going.

Parishioners were advised last year that the diocese intended selling Murphy house, which is the priory occupied by our parish priests. The sale was completed on 10 December 2021, subject to a lease back arrangement until December 2023. This lease back allows the parish time to build a new presbytery and allows our Carmelite priests to remain in residence. The full amount of the lease is being paid for by the diocese. We are grateful to the diocese for this arrangement. As a result, your finance committee together with the help of suitably qualified parishioners formed a sub-committee to work on a plan to rehouse our parish priests in a suitable presbytery. The first meeting of this sub-committee took place in July 2021. A land survey was carried out and plans were drawn up. A full briefing was presented to parishioners on 25 and 28 August.

We were very fortunate to have received two substantial donations towards the building of the new presbytery. One was an amount of \$10,000 from the estate of the late Robert Simpson who was the lead architect on the project. We received another donation of \$100,000 from an anonymous donor and we are most grateful for both those donations. *If you would like to donate to the building project please contact Fr Greg, Michelle Miles (in the parish office on 9144 6998) or Ed Wales (our finance officer on 0412 626 258).*

On the finance side we suffered a slight deficit that would have been greater but for the generosity of our parishioners. We are pleased to report that the loan taken out for the roof repair and the hall renovations is now paid off, so we have no outstanding liabilities at present. We received two grants from the NSW Government because of the decline in our revenue. This helped reduce our deficit for the year. Our Mothers' Day cake stall raised \$3,660 and we are grateful to Kit Ling Chow and her helpers for organising this. We also thank Kit for arranging the sale of various second hand and used items donated by our generous parishioners and friends. If you have any usable but no longer required items please consider donating them to the parish who can then sell or give the items away to those who are needy.

During the year we said goodbye to Belinda, our office manager, and thank her very much for the contribution she has made to the parish. Michelle has taken over the role and we thank her for taking on this responsibility.

Parishioners will have noticed that a new banner has been put up on the Mona Vale Road side of the church advertising the hall for hire. This has led to several bookings being taken for various events, such as children's birthday parties and other family events. The pandemic has unfortunately severely curtailed our ability to hold social and fund-raising events. Now with very few restrictions in place we are looking forward to holding parish events over the coming year. Parishioners will be advised of all upcoming events as they are organised.

In order to be able to better plan and budget our finances we are slowly phasing out our envelope collection and requesting parishioners to donate by way of a direct debit or by monthly or annual credit card donations. We understand that not all parishioners are comfortable with direct debit arrangements so we will not phase out envelopes completely, but we do ask that if you can and have not already, please consider a direct debit or credit card donation for the second collection. It is this second collection that we rely on for the maintenance of the parish and the growth of our pastoral activities. There is a form at the back of the church for this purpose that can be completed and handed to the parish office.

Our parish continues to follow its mission of seeking to "Evangelise, celebrate our faith, foster community and serve God and each other." Our goal is Missionary Discipleship. We are moving from a maintenance church to a missionary one in keeping with Jesus' great commission: "Go make disciples of all nations, baptise them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and teach them to obey all I have commanded you" (Mt 28). In February we were pleased to appoint a parish youth minister, Natalie Yeung, to assist in revitalising our youth. We wish her well in this role. Our mission depends on our parishioners' support and we thank you for your contributions over the last twelve months.

Sacramental programme - The Children's Sacramental Programme is a three stage process that is delivered over a twelve month period. The first sacrament in this programme is Confirmation, followed by Reconciliation and is completed with First Holy Communion, when the children become fully initiated into the Church.

Our thanks go to Gerri Hadwen, our Sacramental Co-Ordinator, for the wonderful work she has done in working with the families to prepare the children for the sacraments. Over the year we had 83 children through the programme, 42 for confirmation and 41 for first Reconciliation. The children came from both our local Corpus Christi Parish School and the state schools in our area.

Catechists - Our catechists, led by Jennifer Perrot, put a lot of work into preparing lessons, activities of significance and attending professional development opportunities. Our catechists bring the Word of God to children in state schools in our area and assist in preparing those children to receive the Sacraments. Due to COVID we are struggling to get catechists and would welcome further volunteers for this very important ministry. Parish Presbytery Briefing - Update

As advertised in recent weeks, information sessions outlining the progress of planning carried out by the Sub-Committee, appointed by the Parish Finance Committee (PFC), have now been provided to parishioners. The content included the details of the proposed new Presbytery and refurbishment of the existing Presbytery/Office building. This content was presented to parishioners on both Thursday evening 25 August and Sunday morning after the 10am mass 28 August.

We are pleased to report that the proposed Presbytery design and concept was well received by parishioners (approximate total of 76) who attended these sessions. PFC Chairperson, Claude Jugmans, informed attendees that during recent meetings with representatives of the Diocesan Office, verbal approval of the design concepts was received. Encouraging support was also shown for the Presbytery project currently being undertaken.

Importantly, it was good to see participants of both sessions, become very involved in the questioning, suggestions and discussion surrounding this matter. The PFC thanks those who were able to attend for their interest and input.

To assist the process of informing the broader parish community, details of the proposed Presbytery design are currently being added to the Parish website and should be available on the website early next week. Additionally, large copies of the design are being prepared for posting on the windows adjacent to the Church entrance.

The next step(s) in this project will be to:

- Complete a formal application to the Diocese for project approval
- Apply for funding via the Catholic Development Fund (CDF)
- Apply to Council for a DA
- Obtain indicative quotes

While these steps are being undertaken (3-6 months), a fund raising committee is to be formed to encourage and co-ordinate all efforts to raise funds for the project. No doubt, parishioners will hear more about this in coming months.


As detailed during the above information sessions, no commitment has been made as to the funding of this project apart from expenses involved to progress this matter to Council for a Development Application.

First Reading

From the book of Exodus Ex 32:7-11. 13-14 The Lord relented and did not send the evil he had threatened.

The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostatised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. "Here is your God, Israel," they have cried, "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!" I can see how headstrong these people are! Leave me, now, my wrath shall blaze out against them and devour them; of you, however, I will make a great nation.' But Moses pleaded with the Lord his God. From the letter of St Paul to Timothy 1 Tm 1:12-17 *Christ came to save sinners.*

I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, and who judged me faithful enough to call me into his service even though I used to be a blasphemer and did all I could to injure and discredit the faith. Mercy, however, was shown me, because until I became a believer I had been acting in ignorance; and the grace of our Lord filled me with faith and with the love that is in Christ Jesus. Here is a saying that you can rely on and nobody should doubt: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. I myself am the greatest of them; and if mercy has been shown to me, it is because Jesus Christ meant to make me the greatest evidence of his inexhaustible patience for all the other people who would later have to trust in him to come to eternal life. To the eternal King, the undying, invisible and only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 15:1-30

There will be joy in heaven over one sinner who does penance.

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them: 'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninetynine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.

He also said, 'A man had two sons. The younger said to his father, "Father, let me have the share of the estate that would come to me." So the father divided the property between them. A few days later, the younger son got together everything he had and left for a distant country where he squandered his money on a life of debauchery.

'When he had spent it all, that country experienced a severe famine, and now he began to feel the pinch, so he hired himself out to one of the local inhabitants who put him on his farm to feed the pigs. And he would willingly have filled his belly with the husks the pigs were eating but no one offered him anything. Then he came to his senses and said, "How many of my father's paid servants have more food than they want, and here am I dying of hunger! I will leave this place and go to my father and say: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as one of your paid servants." So he left the place and went back to his father.

Bring the calf we have been fattening, and kill it; we are going to have a feast, a celebration, because this son of mine was dead and has come back to life; he was lost and is found."
