Dear parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Today is a special day for us as Carmelites in this Carmelite Parish. It is the solemnity of our foundress of St Teresa of Avila (born 1515—died 1582). She is a Spanish mystic, Catholic saint, reformer of the Carmelite order and a doctor of the Church which means that the church acknowledges her eminent sanctity and teachings. She loved the Church, understood as the Body of Chirst and desired to do everything she could to bring healing and contribute to its flourishing. Our Church today needs healing and human flourishing. We, like Teresa, have the opportunity to contribute in these areas through the Plenary Council Dialogue sessions.

She had a wonderful personality. People liked her. She related to God in a real way. I remember on one occasion she and others were crossing a small stream in a horse and cart when the wheel came off. Teresa ended up in the muddy stream. She spontaneously said "Well if that is the way you treat your friends it is no wonder you have so few."

In actual fact she had a deep friendship with Jesus and that is why she could be so real with Him. She describes prayer in terms of friendship. "Mental prayer is nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with Him, who we know loves us."

She says that the human person is like a beautiful castle made up of precious diamonds with many mansions inside. God dwells in the centre. The doorway to a deeper relationship with God is prayer and meditation.

Teresa's own capacity for friendship provides us with a key to help us unlock the depth, riches and originality of her special understanding of prayer. She introduces her explanation with these words: "I trust that in the mercy of God who never fails to repay anyone who has taken Him for a friend. And she concludes it with an exclamation of praise: "Oh what a good friend you make, my Lord." Central is the intimate sharing between friends, "but also integral is the proper atmosphere to facilitate the friendship namely time, space and solitude". The ultimate sharing with Jesus is not only for Teresa but for you and me. The doorway to this intimacy is through prayer, meditation and a radical commitment to Christ as was the case with Teresa.

So, Teresa is a remarkable person. She is a doctor of the church which means that the church acknowledges her eminent sanctity and teaching. She wants us to never lose sight of the Sacred Humanity of Christ and describes prayer in terms of friendship where there is much loving rather than much thinking. Let us ask her to depth our prayers and deepen our friendship with Jesus while keeping our focus on Christ. "Our souls are a paradise in which the Lord takes his delight." So we have a special dignity and the possibility of a growing friendship with Jesus. Let us hunger for this intimacy with Jesus in a way that is committed to his project of loving others.

Give us ears to listen humbly to each other and a discerning heart to hear what you are saying.


