

Dear Parishioners,

Some years ago St Pauls Publications published a book written to help teenage boys on their journey to adulthood. It was called 'You Are Not That Important, and Other Helpful Messages.' Because of its title, the book received an immediate negative reaction. People said, 'you can't say that. You have to tell young people that they are

very important, that they are special,' etc.

We firstly, the book didn't say young people are not important, it simply said that they were not that important. And for many young people it is a relive to know this. Sometimes too much pressure is put on them at too young an age to be responsible for everything. To become adults, we have to learn that we are not the centre of the universe. No, God is the centre of the universe. A tiny baby thinks the whole world revolves around him or her. We become adults when we learn to put God, and the well-being of others, at the centre of our lives and actions.

That John the Baptist had achieved true adult maturity is testified in his words, 'there stands among you—unknown to you—the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal strap.' And in another place he said, 'he {Jesus} must increase and I must decrease '(Jn 3:30). Paradoxically, John the Baptist fulfilled an important role in preparing the way of the Lord because he knew that he was not the most important person.

Human Rights Day 2020: Recover Better - Stand Up for Human Rights

Human Rights Day is observed every year on the 10<sup>th</sup> December — the day the United Nations General Assembly adopted, in 1948, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR). The UDHR is a milestone document that proclaims the inalienable rights which everyone is entitled to as a human being - regardless of race, colour,



religion, sex, language, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status. Available in more than 500 languages, it is the most translated document in the world.

This year's Human Rights Day theme relates to the COVID-19 pandemic and focuses on the need to ensure Human Rights are central to recovery efforts. The theme recognises that the COVID-19 crisis has been fuelled by deepening poverty, rising inequalities, structural and entrenched discrimination and other gaps in human rights protection. Only measures to close these gaps and advance human rights can ensure we fully recover and build back a world that is better, more resilient, just, and sustainable.

Where, after all, do universal human rights begin? In small places, close to home -- so close and so small that they cannot be seen on any maps of the world. [...] Unless these rights have meaning there, they have little meaning anywhere. Without concerted citizen action to uphold them close to home, we shall look in vain for progress in the larger world."



A reading from the prophet Isaiah Is 61:1-2. 10-11

I exult for joy in the Lord.

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord. 'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity,

like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels. 'For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations.'

#### Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 1:6-8. 19-28

There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

A man came, sent by God.

His name was John.

He came as a witness,

as a witness to speak for the light,

so that everyone might believe through him.

He was not the light,

only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
