Dear Parishioners,

The observation of the English mystic poet, William Blake, that

'great things happen when men and mountains meet' is true of such pivotal incidents in the Hebrew and Christian Scriptures as Moses' reception of the Ten Commandments on Mt Sinai (Exodus 19: 16-25; 20: 1-21) and the transfiguration of Jesus 'on the mountain' (often associated with Mount Tabor). Scripture scholars point to several parallels that may be drawn between these two events. In the latter instance, as recorded in all three Synoptic Gospels and now included in the luminous mysteries of the rosary by St John Paul II, Jesus is revealed as the longawaited Messiah. Accompanied by representatives of the Law and the Prophets (Moses and Elijah), he is transfigured in the presence of Peter, James and John—the three apostles who later are witnesses to his agony in the garden (Matthew 26:36-46). Jesus' human bodiliness becomes the vehicle through which his inner reality as God-Man shines forth. Surely this was a source of hope to his disciples after Jesus' prediction of his death by crucifixion had become a reality. Alluding to this event Peter wrote: 'We had seen his majesty for ourselves.... When we were with him on the holy mountain' (2 Peter 1:16-18)



We have families seeking support in helping to "form" their children in the faith at school and some have asked why their children are not getting the SRE Education. Sadly, it is because we do not have enough volunteers and without our volunteers our young people are missing out on their faith formation.

Why not think about sharing your faith and helping parents by taking steps to become a Catechist? **Now** that many are working from home and there is that flexibility, would you?

Who Should Be Involved?

Anyone that loves to share their faith with others and/or feels a tugging in their heart to be involved. The Lord will stir in our hearts a desire to help, to share our faith with our young people. We are inviting you to respond to His call.

What Do I Have To Do

- During the school term give one hour per week to prepare and teach the lesson. If being the teacher seems daunting, then start by becoming a class room assistant.
- A working with Children Check (WWCC) which we can help you apply for.
- Safeguarding training to help develop teaching skills (will require 45 minutes on line).

 Enrol in the CCD Ministry Induction within a year. This has been designed to be very simple and easy.

What help will I get?

- ♦ A teacher's manual containing easy to follow lesson plans.
- Lessons include PowerPoint presentations ready for use in class (so even less preparation time).
- Student activity books for each child.

- ♦ Improve your self-esteem and wellbeing.



FINANCE UPDATE – SIX MONTHS TO 31 DECEMBER 2021

Dear Parishioners

THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY IN TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE

This last six months has been challenging for all of us. The on and off restrictions and the Omicron wave has been quite stressful and has had an effect on our church. Our attendances at Mass are understandably down with the consequent effect of lower collections. We are grateful to those parishioners who continue to support both the parish and our priests with their contributions. The assistance we received from the NSW government certainly helped to reduce our deficit. We are pleased to report that our roof loan is now fully paid off. Our expenses are under control and we continue to closely monitor them.

We encourage parishioners who haven't yet joined the planned giving to participate by way of a direct debit or credit card. If you haven't yet but would like to contribute by direct debit or credit card please either call the Parish Office (9144 6998) or complete the attached **form** and return it to the office or drop it in the second collection bag at the front of the church.

Parishioners will know that Murphy House is now sold and no longer owned by the Diocese. However, the Diocese has entered into a lease agreement with the new owners to allow our priests to remain there until October 2023. This gives us the chance to plan and build a new presbytery. To this end a subcommittee has been formed and has explored a number of options for a new presbytery. At this early stage some preliminary plans have been drawn for a new building alongside the parish office. The subcommittee has recommended that the parish office be renovated at the same time to cater for the longer term needs of the parish as outlined by the parish pastoral council. A full briefing will be given to parishioners to allow questions and comments. The date for the briefing has not yet been set but should be within the next month or so. Parishioners will be given adequate notice of when the briefing will be.

We thank all parishioners for their continued support as we all work together during these difficult times to enhance our Parish.

First Reading

From the book of Genesis Gen 15:5-12. 17-18

God made a covenant with Abraham, his faithful servant.

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified. 'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied, 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a threeyear-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off. Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves.
