"We have found the Messiah" (<u>Gospel</u>)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Yesterday's reflection was all about seeing, and seeing is also the centrepiece of today's scripture. In our first reading, Eli recognises the presence of God in Samuel's encounters and guides him on what to say. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians takes up 'seeing' in a more subtle way, encouraging readers to honour their bodies to truly live as God sees them - as temples of the Spirit. And in our Gospel, we have a number of deep experiences of seeing. John 'stared hard' at Jesus, recognising him as the Messiah and prompting his own disciples to follow him. Jesus saw these disciples and invited them to 'come and see' the place where he was staying. And when one of these disciples, Andrew, brought his brother Simon to meet Jesus, Jesus 'looked hard at him' and bestowed on him a new name, based on what he had seen.

These readings speak of the importance of recognising God's presence in our lives, around us and within us. Today, let's reflect: how has God revealed Godself to me?

### **The Word**

## Sunday 14 January 2024: Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Collect

O God, who see how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity, enable us, we pray, to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, you Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit. God, for ever and ever.

#### First Reading

From the first book of Samuel 3:3-10.19

Speak, O Lord, your servant is listening. Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am'. Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down.' Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli then understood that it was the Lord who was calling the boy, and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

The Lord then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.' Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him and let no word of his fall to the ground.

### Second Reading

From the letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 6:13-15. 17-20

Your bodies are members of the body of Christ.
The body is not meant for fornication; it is for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. God, who raised the Lord from the dead, will by his power raise us up too.

You know, surely, that your bodies are members making up the body of Christ; anyone who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him.

Keep away from fornication. All the other sins are committed outside the body; but to fornicate is to sin against your own body. Your body, you know, is the temple of the Holy Spirit, which is in you since you have received him from God. You are not your own property; you have been bought and paid for. That is why you should use your body for the glory of God.

#### Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John 1:35-42

They saw where Jesus lived and they stayed with him. As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said "Look, there is the Lamb of God."

Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, "What do you want?"

They answered, "Rabbi" - which means Teacher -, "where do you live?"

"Come and see" he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour.

One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter.

Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him,

"We have found the Messiah" - which means the Christ – and he took Simon to Jesus.

Jesus looked hard at him and said, "You are Simon, son of John; you are to be called Cephas" – meaning Rock.
