

Dear Parishioners,

Today as a Christian community, on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we gather again to celebrate the Eucharist, meal and

sacrifice, in response to Jesus' ordinance, 'Do this in memory of me' (Lk 22:19). We do so, mindful of the fact that, whenever we take communion, we look back in remembrance of Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples (and his saving death) and we look forward in hope to the heavenly banquet which it prefigures (see Lk 13:29; 14:15; 22: 29-30; Rev 19: 6-9). On Holy Thursday we recalled the institution of the Holy Eucharist: today we celebrate in a particular manner the Real Presence of Jesus in the Sacrament. Let us take care that our reception of this inestimable gift never becomes a merely perfunctory act. Listen to St Augustine: 'If you, therefore, are Christ's body and members, it is your own mystery that is placed on the Lord's table! It is your own mystery that you are receiving! You are saying "Amen" to what you are: your response is a personal signature, affirming your faith. When you hear "The Body of Christ", you reply "Amen". Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your "Amen" may ring true! (Sermo 272)

CORPUS CHRISTI FEAST DAY

Today is the feast of Corpus Christi and we are blessed to have Bishop Anthony as our main celebrant on our Feast Day at the 10am Sunday Eucharist. We are the Body of Christ (Corpus Christi) and individually members of it. We draw strength from the Eucharist to live Eucharistic lives. No one has all the gifts and we need each other. We have the privilege and responsibility to be Christ's presence and action in the world today drawing strength from the Eucharist.

I would like to show how the Eucharist is linked with our lives in a simple way by taking the words of institution: The priest takes bread, blesses it, breaks it and then gives the Eucharist at communion. What is the meaning of these words and how may they be related to our lives? Key words are "take", "bless", "break" and "give".

"Take": This refers to the offertory when the bread and wine are brought to the altar by parishioners at the offertory procession. The bread and wine symbolically represent our lives which are brought to the altar with whatever has and is happening in our lives. It is this bread that is "taken". At the offertory procession do you see your lives being brought to the altar?

"Bless": This refers to the Eucharistic prayer during which the priests takes the bread (our lives), blesses them by calling down the Spirit and the bread is changed into the very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. The resurrected Lord is sacramentally present and our lives are linked with Jesus' offering to the Father which is associated with the infinite merits of the cross sacramentally present. This offering along with ourselves are offered to the Father. Infinite graces are available. We tap into these graces as long as we come with the right dispositions of humble and contrite hearts. We gain little or nothing if we simply come in a routine reception.

"Break": This is the fraction rite where the bread is broken and we say: "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us etc". Just as Jesus showed his infinite love for us by dying on the cross for you and me, we are to pay the price of loving God in a way that is committed to his project of loving family, friends, parishioners and the wider community.

"Give": This refers to the reception of communion with proper dispositions. Normally when we eat something such as chicken it changes into us but when we receive Jesus we become more Christ like and have the grace to be Jesus' presence in the world. We become the Body of Christ and individually a member of it.

Happy Corpus Christi Day.

MASS HAS RETURNED TO CORPUS CHRISTI

We will be holding mass at the following times:

- Monday to Friday at 9:00am Mass and the possibility of Reconciliation*
- Saturday at 9:00am Mass, the possibility of Reconciliation and Exposition
- Saturday at 6:00pm—Mass only
- Sunday at 8am, 10am & 6pm Mass only
- * During the week, Reconciliation and/or private prayer will be available for 30 minutes immediately after Mass. Reconciliation at other times is available by appointment.

Following the guidelines set by the NSW Government, masses will be limited to 50 people plus the priest.

In any gathering, social distancing measures of 4 square meters per person and hand sanitising needs to be maintained. We are also required to clean the church after each gathering.


