Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners,

In 587 BCE the Babylon army conquered Jerusalem. The invading soldiers demolished the city walls, burned downed the temple, destroyed buildings and led its leading citizens and artisans off into captivity in Babylon.

In exile the Jews soon realised that while they were captives in body, they did not have to be captives in spirit. The Babylonians could control where they lived but not what they believed. A faithful group of Jews refused to forget their religious heritage. They resisted every effort of their captors to entice them to ridicule their faith. They refused to allow the beauty of Babylon, with its rivers and poplars, to replace in their hearts the beauty of Jerusalem, the holy city. This resistance is well expressed in today's responsorial psalm. It reveals the peoples' immense grief at the loss of their homeland and their resolve never to forget the God of Israel despite the seemingly hopeless situation they were in. Like the exiles, we can sometimes feel that we are living in an alien land. We are surrounded by a culture that oftentimes does not recognise Christ or Christian values. Like them we can be tempted to forget our religious heritage. We need to remain faithful to Christ not only for ourselves but also for the well-being of all peoples. God loves the world so much and desires that everyone be saved. By our Christian witness we can be instruments through which the saving grace of Christ is communicated to all.

PARISH FINANCE UPDATE SIX MONTHS TO 31 DECEMBER 2020

Dear Parishioners

THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY IN TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE

Over the first six months of the financial year your parish has managed to achieve a surplus of income over expenses, primarily due to the boost we received from the Government. It is apparent from our financial statement that collections are holding up and we are most grateful for your generosity, particularly as we have not been able to pass the plate around for the first and second collections. The Tap & Go facility that was installed over this period has proved successful and is slowly replacing the loose second collection. Thank you to the parishioner who donated two of the Tap & Go machines.

Our Alpha and Discipleship programmes are well supported and are virtually self-funding. We have shown the income and expenditure from these programmes separately in our financial statement.

As we no longer qualify for Government assistance the Jobkeeper and stimulus incentives have ceased.

We encourage parishioners who haven't yet joined the planned giving to participate by way of a direct debit or credit card. If you haven't yet but would like to contribute by direct debit or credit card please either call the Parish Office (9144 6998) or complete the attached **form** and return it to the office or drop it in the second collection bag at the front of the church

Expenses are generally in line with past periods. However, our repairs and maintenance is increasing as the parish office, which is now quite old, requires additional maintenance. Over the last six months the carpets in the main areas of the parish office were replaced. We will need to spend more money on the parish office over the next year.

Parishioners will know that it is the intention of the Diocese to sell Murphy House. We are in discussions with the Diocese as to what this means for our Carmelite community and what arrangements need to be made to find accommodation for our parish priests.

The amount owing on the roof loan at 31 December 2019 was \$30,014 and we continue to make our normal monthly repayments as shown in our financial statement.

We thank all parishioners for their continued support as we all work together during these difficult times to enhance our Parish.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Let us pray that we may experience the sacrament of reconciliation with renewed depth, to taste the infinite mercy of God.

The Word

Sunday 14 March 2021: Fourth Sunday of Lent

First Reading

From the second book of Chronicles 2 Chr 36:14-16. 19-23

The wrath and the mercy of the Lord are revealed in the exile and liberation of his people.

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy.

Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke through Jeremiah, 'Until this land has enjoyed its sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep sabbath throughout the days of its desolation. And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: 'Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up." The Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 136. R. v.6 (R.) Let my tongue be silenced, if ever I forget you!

- 1. By the rivers of Babylon there we sat and wept, remembering Zion; on the poplars that grew there we hung our harps. (R.)
- 2. For it was there that they asked us, our captors, for songs, our oppressors, for joy. 'Sing to us,' they said, 'one of Zion's songs.' (R.)
- 3. O how could we sing the song of the Lord on alien soil? If I forget you, Jerusalem, let my right hand wither! (R.)
- 4. O let my tongue cleave to my mouth if I remember you not, if I prize not Jerusalem above all my joys! (R.)

Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Ephesians Eph 2:4-10

When we were dead through sins, he brought us to life. God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy: when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ – it is through grace that you have been saved – and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus. This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich he is in grace. Because it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit. We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it.

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 3:14-21

God sent his Son into the world that we might be saved through him.

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him.

Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son. On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil.

And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'
