"God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son" (Gospel)

Dear parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

What a juxtaposition we find in the title of today's feast. How can we exalt in the cross on which Jesus died such a torturous death? Well, when seen from the perspective of the resurrection, the picture starts to become clear. The cross was the means by which God, in the person of Jesus, would, in his endless love and compassion, bring a wayward world back home to him. Today's Gospel gives us perhaps the most well-known Bible verse of all, in John 3:16: "Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life." God didn't send his Son to condemn us but to save us. Out of his great love for humanity, God reached down into a broken human world, and Jesus, by bearing our sins on the cross, redeemed us, and in the resurrection, showed us the way back to communion with God and to eternal life in God's presence. We exalt the cross because it restores to us all that was lost, and it stands forever as a reminder of God's endless outpouring of love for us.

What gifts of the Holy Spirits have you been given?







Social Justice Gathering

The 2025–2026 Australian Catholic Bishops Conference Social Justice Statement, *Signs of Hope on the Edge*, calls us to see, listen to, and walk alongside those on the margins. We are challenged to move beyond charity into action, recognising every person's name, dignity, and story, building relationships rooted in solidarity and turning reflection into response.

On Saturday, 27th September, you are invited to join a discussion and reflection on the statement organised by the Justice and Peace Office. The event will include:

- First-hand voices from people with lived experience of homelessness and experiences of poor mental health.
- Scenario-based activities inspired by the Statement's reflection questions which will invite participants into real-life situations and explore real-life solutions.
- Table talks to unpack the Bishops' call for encounter, identify gaps in current responses, and co-create solutions.
- Action mapping to guide parishes, schools, and communities in committing to tangible local advocacy and outcomes.
- Take away resources that prompt discussion, education, and guidance to move beyond the day.

We are collecting donations of clothes, toys, games, and books for the family. Clothing sizes are as follows:



The Word

Sunday 14th of September 2025: The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Collect

O God, who willed that your Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we, who have known his mystery on earth, may merit the grace of his redemption in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the book of Numbers 21:4-9

When those that were afflicted looked upon it, they were healed.

On the way through the wilderness, the Israelites lost patience. They spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt to die in this wilderness? For there is neither bread nor water here; we are sick of this unsatisfying food.'

At this God sent fiery serpents among the people; their bite brought death to many in Israel. The people came and said to Moses, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you. Intercede for us with the Lord to save us from these serpents.' Moses interceded for the people, and the Lord answered him, 'Make a fiery serpent and put it on a standard. If anyone is bitten and looks at it, he shall live.' So Moses fashioned a bronze serpent which he put on a standard, and if anyone was bitten by a serpent, he looked at the bronze serpent and lived.

- Give heed, my people, to my teaching; turn your ear to the words of my mouth.

He humbled himself, therefore God had exalted him. The state of Jesus was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
