When John the Baptist heard in prison of the works of the Christ, he sent his disciples to Jesus with this question, "Are you the one who is to come?" (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and Visitors to the Parish

The lectionary offers us a choice of two very different responses to today's psalm: one is a cry for help, 'Lord, come and save us'; the other a joyful outburst of praise, 'Alleluia'. Which response will we choose?

Both responses are very appropriate for today's psalm which is a rich expression of faith in God. The sacred writer praises God who keeps faith forever, who cares for the oppressed and marginalised, who heals the sick and who sees justice done. When we respond, 'Lord, come and save us', we are saying, 'Lord, we believe you are such a God and we ask you to reveal your saving power and faithful love in our present difficult circumstances'. When we select the joy-filled response of 'Alleluia' we are saying, 'Lord, we believe you are such a God because we are presently experiencing your wonderful saving love'.

Perhaps we are feeling a little of both, like today's liturgy which intermixes the themes of joy and patient waiting. We rejoice in God's saving presence in our lives and in our world as we witness progress, albeit slow, in human rights and justice. But we also recognise ongoing injustice and suffering, areas in which we remain unfree, and people still marginalised and abandoned. In the one prayer we mix 'alleluias' with 'Lord, come and save

Whatever our circumstances, faith in God who keeps faith forever is what is most important. As Jesus says in today's Gospel, 'Happy the one who does not lose faith in me'.



THE ADVENT WREATH—WHAT IS ITS MEANING?

One of the major symbols of the Advent season is the wreath. The encircling wreath is symbolic of God without beginning or end and the green foliage represents our hope in God.

There are usually five candles in the wreath, a central white candle representing the light of Christ that came into the world and then four outside candles that are usually purple and rose coloured. The first candle is generally symbolic of Hope and Expectation. The third candle – the rose or pink candle – celebrates the Joy that is anticipated in the coming of Christ. The progressive lighting of the candles marks the journey towards the Nativity.


Alpha and by the beginning of Term 2 we were ready to bring it to our parish. This was no mean feat! There began, on the 14th May 2019, the first parish Alpha!

Fr Greg and Jen would like to extend a very heartfelt thank you to everyone on team that has played a part in what has been an immensely successful Alpha journey this year. Some of the team have done 3 Alphas this year and we are very grateful for the generosity and commitment of the team in every way. Our hospitality team headed by Victoria Galcsik (who was also part of our pilot group) have done a wonderful job feeding everyone on a Tuesday night. Thank you to all those people who have

contributed food to Alpha and turned up to help. I understand some come for the food! That in itself is a great testimony to your efforts

What is the impact of Alpha in a Parish?

Alpha helps the parish to become an evangelising community. Those who have tried Alpha often want to share their experience with friends and invite them to the next course. The Alpha small groups model hospitality, which can permeate the entire life of the parish and for those who have been on Alpha this year, will attest to this.

It also helps the parish to foster personal encounters and relationships with Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. Often this experience acts as a catalyst for people to begin or continue growing as disciples. Through the simple model used on Alpha for prayer ministry, people learn how to pray for one another and it becomes a normal part of life in the parish. In addition, they also begin to serve in other parish ministries, because they want to serve the Lord rather than it being an action.

Alpha and Missionary Discipleship

Alpha engages lay people in the life and mission of he Church. Often guests who have experienced Alpha go on to become effective and confident evangelisers as they share the impact that Jesus has had on their lives. It is therefore, not about whether you think you need Alpha or not. It is about how I can live out my baptismal promise and bring people to Jesus.

Alpha is for everyone despite where you may think someone is on their faith journey. Everyone needs friendships. It is a wonderful tool to bring people together. When community gather, friendships are made. We have already

seen this happen in our Corpus Christi community this year.

The Word

Sunday 15 December 2019: Third Sunday of Advent

First Reading

From the prophet Isaiah Is 35:1-6, 10

God himself will come and save us.

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonguil, let it rejoice and sing for joy. The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return. They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended. The Word of the Lord.

You also must be patient; do not lose heart, the Lord's coming will be soon.

Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. The Word of the Lord.

From the holy Gospel according to Matthew Mt 11:2-11

Are you the one who is to come, or must we wait for someone else?

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.'

As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'
