Dear parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The audience for Matthew's Gospel was a community of Jewish and Gentile people who had become Christians.

Matthew is anxious to assure both groups that the Christian community is respectful of their traditions and that Jesus did not come to abolish the Law and the Prophets but to complete them. The Gospel writer, Matthew, shows a respect for the old Law but he is also enthusiastic for the new vision that Jesus had brought to its interpretation. He shows Jesus as the true Messiah, the new Moses, who will fulfil God's promises to Israel.

Today we hear Jesus confirming the old Law and adding a higher expectation about the way that Law is kept. This is about keeping the Law in thoughts as well as in action. It is not just about how we do this or that, it is more about why we are doing it. With the psalmist I pray:

Open my eyes that I may consider the wonders of your law.

SOCIAL JUSTICE COLUMN

REVIEW OF AUSTRALIA'S UMAN RIGHTS RECORD



Every five years member states of the United Nations (UN) undergo a Universal Periodic Review at the UN Human Rights Council where their human rights records are scrutinised. Australia appeared before the Council in January 2026.

The Periodic Review flagged persistent concerns about racism and Indigenous justice, alongside progress on gender inequality and called on Australia to: Raise the age of criminal responsibility to at least 14, noting that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people remain overrepresented in the criminal justice system End its policy of detaining refugees and people seeking asylum offshore Legislate a Human Rights Act, highlighting that Australia's federal laws do not protect people's human rights including the rights to health, housing, and education. The Albanese government must respond to these recommendations by July 2026.

As noted by the Australian Human Rights Commission President Hugh de Kretser: "As a wealthy, stable democracy, Australia should be leading the world on human rights. This review highlighted many areas where we can and must do better."



Centenary Jubilee of the Schoenstatt Sisters of Mary

The Secular Institute of the Schoenstatt Sisters of Mary was founded on October 1, 1926, in Germany by Father Joseph Kentenich. Since then, the community has developed and expanded to be present across all continents.

For the centenary jubilee from October 1, 2025 until November 4, 2026, Pope Leo XIV has granted a plenary indulgence for the Original Shrine in Germany, as well as all churches, chapels, and shrines for which the sisters are responsible.

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins; it strengthens us on the path of conversion and spiritual renewal. An indulgence can also be applied to the deceased.

Conditions to obtain an indulgence:

- Make a pilgrimage to the Schoenstatt Shrine or House Chapel;
- Receive Holy Communion; *
- Go to Confession and have complete detachment from sin; *
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father: Our Father, Creed, invocation of the Blessed Virgin Mary as Queen of Peace and Mother of Mercy.

*This can take place in the days before or after visiting the Shrine or House Chapel.



On Wednesday, 18th February, the Church celebrates Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of the Season of Lent.

Beginning with the receiving of ashes on Ash Wednesday, the Season of Lent takes us on a journey into the wilderness, preparing us for the Resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.

In the words of Bishop Anthony Randazzo, Lent "invites us to pause and ponder our earthly and spiritual lives before God.

"Through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we prepare our hearts to enter more fully into the Paschal Mystery. Through the celebration of Holy Mass, Jesus' saving sacrifice is made present, drawing us deeply into His passion and uniting us in His love."

To accompany the People of God in Broken Bay this Lent, the Diocese has prepared a Lenten resource, ***Walking in the Wilderness: A Lenten Pilgrimage Towards Easter***.

The resource is based around the Sunday Gospel Readings in Lent, with prayers, reflections and discussion questions, helping to draw the faithful closer into the Season and truly walk in the wilderness with Jesus Christ. Hard copies of this resource can be found in the Church foyer.

The Rite of Sending



We have several catechumens who will be called to the altar at the 10am mass this Sunday. Just after the homily in a short ceremony to officially send them off by this community to the cathedral where next week Bishop Anthony will officially welcome them in a special rite called the **Rite of Election**.

The Rite of Election is an act of acceptance made by the church, founded on the election by God in whose name the church acts. The bishop will enroll the names of the catechumens (non-baptized) in the *Book of the Elect* based on the testimony of the parish community as a result of their prayerful study and catechumenal formation in the many weeks in our RCIA programme of the catholic faith.


We congratulate them and pray that they will be greatly blessed as they continue their faith journey.



The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday remind us of our mortality and symbolize the spirit of penance that marks the Lenten season.

Ashes were commonly used in ancient religions (including Judaism) as an expression of sorrow and humiliation.


In the early Church, Jewish converts

introduced a similar practice into the Christian liturgy. By being marked with ashes, a Catholic today is recognized by the community gathered as one who has chosen to repent of sin and believe in the Good News.

We meet weekly during school term







Collect

First Reading

From the book of Ecclesiasticus Sir 15:15-20

He never commanded anyone to be godless. If you wish, you can keep the commandments, to behave faithfully is within your power. He has set fire and water before you; put out your hand to whichever you prefer. Man has life and death before him; whichever a man likes better will be given him. From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 2:6-10

God in his wisdom predestined our glory before the ages began.

We have a wisdom to offer those who have reached maturity: not a philosophy of our age, it is true, still less of the masters of our age, which are coming to their end. The hidden wisdom of God which we teach in our mysteries is the wisdom that God predestined to be for our glory before the ages began. It is a wisdom that none of the masters of this age have ever known, or they would not have crucified the Lord of Glory; we teach what scripture calls: the things that no eye has seen and no ear has heard, things beyond the mind of man, all that God has prepared for those who love him.

These are the very things that God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit reaches the depths of everything, even the depths of God.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery within his heart.'

'Again, you have learnt how it was said to your ancestors: You must not break your oath, but must fulfil your oaths to the Lord. But I say this to you: do not swear at all. All you need to say is "Yes" if you mean yes and "No" if you mean no; anything more than this comes from the evil one.'
