Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

A renowned spiritual writer has said that great dogmas of the Church are almost always paradoxical, and we have to live with paradox. He continues: "Mystery is not something we can't know. Mystery is endless knowability on many different levels." A central mystery of our faith is of course the Trinity. Perhaps today's chosen readings touch on some of those levels. The Spirit, in the tradition of the Gospel of John, is clearly the continuing living presence of Jesus. When Jesus meets the disciples after the resurrection, he breathes his life spirit into them and commissions them to continue his mission of forgiveness and peace. The living Spirit of Jesus within them will enable them to come to the fuller understanding of all that he has taught them.

Writing to the community in Rome, Paul invites us to reflect on the liberating effect of the love of God which enfolds us when we allow the Holy Spirit to enter our lives. Today let us pray for that Wisdom, that delights to be with us, so that we may gradually deepen our understanding of the Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – and be caught up in wonder, praise and thanksgiving.

HOPES AND DREAMS FOR ST IVES PARISH

Forming a picture of the future that is in harmony with our values and produces passion'

Corpus Christi has the vision to be "an invitational parish that leads people to experience and respond to God's love, continually growing in relationship with Jesus as missionary disciples who connect and serve, pray and worship, give and actively share our gifts in the power of the Holy Spirit." (Parish Vision).

We have started to embark on the journey with you, our parishioners, and guided by the Holy Spirit, to try to discover what it means to be a Catholic parish in St Ives in 2025. In our journey together, we will:

- Develop or clarify our parish mission
- Agree new priorities for our parish
- Consider strengths and opportunities in the community that we operate in

The first step in our journey together was a call to share our dreams. The sharing of our dreams gave us the first hints of where, through each one of us, the Spirit may be leading us.

Thank you for those who responded to our request for hopes and dreams for our parish. Your input is vital because such information provides clear direction which leadership would want to respect before making any important decisions or plans for the future of the parish.

This is the very beginning stage and so I would like to begin giving you some feedback on what you envisaged. The basic feedback for St Ives Parish, for the parish community and dreams for the church and school precinct falls into three main categories:

- 1. Dreams
- 2. Obstacles or challenges
- 3. First things to focus on

This week I will focus on giving feedback on dreams for St Ives community, the parish community and the Church and school precinct.

Concise Report: Dreams and Challenges for St lves Church and Parish Community

Part 1: Dreams for the St Ives Church

Parishioners desire a **welcoming**, **vibrant church** that fosters growth, inclusivity, and connection. Key visions include:

- A strong youth group to teach young people about God's word and provide support.
- **More shade and outdoor spaces** to encourage post-Mass fellowship.
- Enhancements to the liturgy, such as updates to pews, kneelers, and the introduction of a more beautiful, reverent setting.
- A focus on beauty and sacredness in the church, ensuring that it's a place that lifts the mind to God immediately upon entering.
- Engagement with young people, ensuring they are inspired and included in the faith, as well as outreach to lapsed Catholics.
- A **community** that addresses social issues like mental illness, homelessness, and domestic violence through collective action.

Part 2: Dreams for the Parish Community Parishioners envision a closer-knit, hands-on community that builds relationships, particularly among families and youth. They hope for:

- Increased participation from families, especially those with young children, and a youth group that can connect younger generations to the church.
- Social and spiritual formation events, including family-friendly activities, regular picnics, hikes, and talks to foster bonding and outreach.
- A strong sense of inclusivity, where people from all walks of life-regardless of background-feel embraced and involved.
- More volunteer involvement from the wider community, with streamlined efforts to avoid burnout.

Part 3: Dreams for the Church and School Precinct The **integration between the parish and school** is a key focus for the future:

- More **frequent involvement of schoolchildren** in Mass, including altar serving and participating in liturgies.
- Closer relationships between the school and parish, with shared activities that encourage both spiritual and social growth.
- **Physical improvements** to the precinct, including well-maintained gardens and clear Catholic symbols to remind the community of its spiritual mission.

FATHER CHRIS RILEY'S YOUTH OFF THE STREETS

I am currently recruiting additional people for our food roster for Father Chris Riley's Youth off the Street's Don Bosco House, in Marrickville. Families from the Corpus Christi community have been supporting the house in Marrickville for the last 20 years. There are approximately 20 families/people who provide a frozen home cooked meal in a tinfoil container (you can find these in Woolworths 20x18x5cm), once a month, which is collected by one of the volunteers at their home, in the St Ives area, on a Sunday morning. They are then taken by the designated volunteer, that afternoon, in eskies to Don Bosco in Marrickville. We only need, at the moment, people who can provide the frozen meal not the delivery to Marrickville.

First Reading

From the book of Proverbs Prv 8:22-31

Wisdom was born before the earth was made. The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries - and the waters will not invade the shore when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.
