COVID 19 UPDATE

As you may be aware from recent media reports, authorities are expecting an increase in all respiratory viruses this winter due to open borders, increased travel and the reduction in public health restrictions. The Parish Office recently liaised with NSW Health to ensure it is taking appropriate measures to keep our parish community safe, particularly our vulnerable parishioners including the elderly, pregnant or immunocompromised. To reduce the risk of infection and illness, we would appreciate if all parishioners could consider the following:

- use hand sanitiser when entering the church;
- wear a mask during Mass .Although public health rules regarding the wearing of masks have eased, NSW Health still recommends wearing a mask indoors, particularly when a safe distance cannot be maintained. Masks provide an additional layer of protection so please wear one if you can;
- physically distance from other family groups or individuals when seated in the church, leaving the church and/or talking outside the church;
- have a flu shot and keep up- to- date with your COVID-19 vaccinations. NSW Health has advised that it is safe to have both the flu and COVID-19 vaccination at the same time; and
- stay at home if you are feeling unwell and/or have any respiratory symptoms.

I am sure you will appreciate that as the weather gets colder, it will not be practical to keep the windows and doors of the church open during Mass as the church will need to be heated. By implementing the above measures, we can all help to keep our family, friends and parish community as healthy as possible. We are also now able to pass the collection plates around at each mass..

The Word Sunday 15 May 2022, Fifth Sunday of Easter

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 14:21-27

They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them. Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

He will wipe away all the tears from their eyes. I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth; the first heaven and the first earth had disappeared now, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the holy city, and the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, as beautiful as a bride all dressed for her husband. Then I heard a loud voice call from the throne, 'You see this city? Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God; his name is God-with-them. He will wipe away all tears from their eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. The world of the past has gone.' Then the One sitting on the throne spoke: 'Now I am making the whole of creation new.' The Word of the Lord.
