Dear Parishioners

On the occasion of the canonisation of St Faustina Kowalska on 30 April 2000, Pope John Paul II dedicated the Second Sunday of Easter to Divine Mercy. This feast reminds us that God's greatest act of mercy is finally available to us through his incarnate Son, Jesus.

Pope Fancis recognises that reconciliation and forgiveness are ongoing tasks. In his homily on Divine Mercy Sunday on April 19, 2020, he answers the usual objections: "But I keep falling!" He says, "God never tires of reaching out to us to lift us up when we fall. He wants us to see him, not as a taskmaster with whom we have to settle accounts, but as our Father who always raises us up. In life we go forward tentatively, uncertainly, like a toddler who takes a few steps and falls; a few steps more and falls again, yet each time his father puts him back on his feet. The hand that always puts us back on our feet is mercy: God knows that without mercy we will remain on the ground, that in order to keep walking, we need to be put back on our feet."

We thank Jesus for giving the human race complete and unmerited reconciliation. By confessing our sins and failings to God, we also confess our complete love and trust in Jesus, Divine Mercy, as we acclaim with Thomas, "My Lord, and my God!"


Webinar

The Chancery is seeking to recruit a temporary Project Officer to undertake the project management of a variety of Diocesan projects, namely WYD and Ignite.





PROPOSAL TO TRIAL AN EARLIER SUNDAY NIGHT MASS TIME

Dear Parishioners,

The Parish Council would like to propose a trial to change the time of Sunday night Mass from 6pm to 5pm. We understand that changing mass time will not suit everyone as it will disrupt certain habits. This is why we would like to get feedback from as many people as possible as we endeavour to listen to your needs and pray that the Holy Spirit may guide all of us to do what is best for the whole parish.

We propose this earlier time for a number of reasons. We hope that it will accommodate better the needs of different parishioners, including those with difficulties travelling in the cooler months. As well, we hope that this will enable the parish to plan various activities to take place after Sunday night Mass to continue to build a sense of community and belonging in the parish. For example this might include activities for the youth, parish celebrations, discussion of our spiritual journey and faith formation. Having the Mass starting earlier at 5pm should allow parishioners to get home earlier after any event.

We suggest trialing this from Sunday 7th May 2023 until Sunday 24th September 2023


Youth Group

The Word

Sunday 16 April 2023, Second Sunday of **Easter (of Divine Mercy)**

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 2:42-47

The faithful lived together and owned everything in common.

The whole community remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to the brotherhood, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers. The many miracles and signs worked through the apostles made a deep impression on everyone. The faithful all lived together and owned everything in common; they sold their goods and possessions and shared out the proceeds among themselves according to what each one needed. They went as a body to the Temple every day but met in their houses for the breaking of bread; they shared their food gladly and generously; they praised God and were looked up to by everyone. Day by day the Lord added to their community those destined to be saved. The Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm 117:2-4. 13-15. 22-24. R.

(R.) Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting.

Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' Let the sons of Aaron say: 'His love has no end.' Let those who fear the Lord say: 'His love has no end.' (R.)

I was thrust, thrust down and falling but the Lord was my helper. The Lord is my strength and my song; he was my saviour. There are shouts of joy and victory in the tents of the just. (R.)

The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone. This is the work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes. This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad. (R.)

Second Reading

From the letter of St Peter 1 Pt 1:3-9

He has given us a new birth as his children, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead. Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy has given us a new birth as his sons, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead, so that we have a sure hope and the promise of an inheritance that can never be spoilt or soiled and never fade away, because it is being kept for you in the heavens. Through your faith, God's power will guard you until the salvation which has been prepared is revealed at the end of time. This is a cause of great joy for you, even though you may for a short time have to bear being plagued by all sorts of trials; so that, when Jesus Christ is revealed, your faith will

have been tested and proved like gold - only it is more precious than gold, which is corruptible even though it bears testing by fire - and then you will have praise and glory and honour. You did not see him, yet you love him; and still without seeing him, you are already filled with a joy so glorious that it cannot be described, because you believe; and you are sure of the end to which your faith looks forward, that is, the salvation of your souls.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 20:19-31

After eight days Jesus came in and stood among

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me,

so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
