Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Today's Gospel is taken from the sermon Jesus gave on a mountain in Israel, a lovely place overlooking the Sea of Galilee. In these passages Jesus refers to the law of God given to Moses on another mountain, Mount Sinai. The first reading, from the Book of Sirach or Ecclesiasticus, is about choosing to keep the commandments, choosing good rather than evil. The Psalmist also exhorts us to wholeheartedly follow God's law.

Paul preaches about the mysterious, hidden, wisdom of God, revealed by the Spirit. Jesus who is the Wisdom of God, wants the people to go beyond legalistic following of the law as taught by the scribes and Pharisees. He teaches the people with authority, proclaiming 'I say to you...' Through him, the God of Moses and the spirit of the law are fully revealed. God's law is about right relationships, and the second great commandment—loving your neighbour in sincerity and goodness as you love yourself.

As a Christian, a follower of Jesus, do I pray to the Spirit of God to help me make the hard choices, to choose what is right and good? Is it possible for me to love others, even those who wrong me?

The church by its very nature is to be missionary. A practical, non-threatening way that this may occur is through Alpha in a shared meal, a short video on our faith in a way that touches the heart, and a friendly sharing in a group. So Alpha is a way to fulfil the Lord's command to move from being a maintenance church to a missionary one.

ST THERESE (Patroness of Missions)

In keeping with an ever deepening relationship with Jesus this Church is privileged to have the relics of St Therese with the relics of her parents, Saints Louis and Zelig Martin on the 5th of March. It is a Thursday and so there will be a welcoming of the relics, followed by a mass of St Therese involving the Corpus Christi School at 9:30am. Among other things in venerating these Saints we will aim to have Bishop Anthony here to celebrate a special mass at 7:30pm. We will give more details later.

LENTEN PREPARATION

We will aim, with the help of our Parish Council, to work out ways of preparing for the Plenary Council in its discernment phase during Lent. There are six themes resulting from the listening phase which are:

- Missionary and evangelising;
- Inclusive, participatory and synodal;
- Prayerful and Eucharistic;
- Humble, healing and merciful;
- A joyful, hope-filled and servant community; and
- Open to conversion, renewal and reform.

The aim will be to reflect and discern prayerfully on the themes in a way that is relevant to our church.

So Alpha, St Therese, who is Patroness of Missions, and the discernment phase on our Lenten preparation are all focussed on Christ and are in keeping with the Lord's command to go make disciples.

CORPUS CHRISTI PARISH

REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2019

Over the twelve months to June 2019 our Parish has continued to follow its mission of seeking to “Evangelise, celebrate our faith, foster community and serve God and each other.” Our goal is Missionary Discipleship. We are moving from a maintenance church to a missionary one in keeping with Jesus’ great commission: “Go make disciples of all nations, baptise them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and teach them to obey all I have commanded you” (Mt 28).

To this end we have run 1 pilot Alpha programme and two regular Alpha programmes in 2019. Individuals have got to know each other better and a significant number have been touched by the Spirit in relation to their faith. Alpha is also a leadership pipeline. We are slowly moving to being an invitational church. 90% of Catholics do not come to church. We need to reach out to these. Alpha is a tool to help in this area. We have discipleship programs to help after Alpha: Lectio, Big Picture and other similar programmes. In 2020 we will run two Alpha programmes as well as some discipleship activities.

Our mission depends on our parishioners’ support and we thank you for your contributions over the last twelve months.

Achievements over the last year include:

- replacement of our ageing sound system
- installation of the air conditioners in the church and in the hall
- installation of the CCTV and sensor lights to help prevent any break ins
- the Easter egg raffle. Our thanks to those parishioners who donated Easter eggs and who bought tickets in the raffle
- the receipt of some generous donations from parishioners that assisted in paying for the air conditioners and the sound system

Sacramental programme

The Children's Sacramental Programme is a three stage process that is delivered over a twelve month period. The first sacrament in this programme is Confirmation, followed by Reconciliation and is completed with First Holy Communion, when the children become fully initiated into the Church.

Our thanks go to Gerri Hadwen, our Sacramental Co-Ordinator, for the wonderful work she has done in working with the families to prepare the children for the sacraments.

Over the year we had 145 children through the programme, 47 for confirmation and 49 for each of reconciliation and first Eucharist. The children came from both our local Corpus Christi Parish School and the state schools in our area.

Collections

First Collection: The Diocese collects 15% of the first collection for their sustention fund and a further 8.54% for the CWF. The sustention fund supports the priests and bishop of the Diocese. The balance of the first collection goes to the Carmelite community.

Second collection: This collection including the planned giving (envelopes or direct debit) is for the needs of the Parish. These funds support our parish ministries, meet the administration costs including electricity and insurance and the maintenance of the parish buildings as detailed in the income and expenditure account. The Diocese levies us a percentage of our second collection (currently 8.54%) for the CWF. If our separate CWF collection done three times a year does not cover the levy the balance is paid from our second collection. Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners we have not had to use any of the second collection to cover the levy.

Catechists

Our catechists, led by Jennifer Perrot, put a lot of work into preparing lessons, activities of significance and attending professional development opportunities. Our catechists bring the Word of God to children in state schools in our area and assist in preparing those children to receive the Sacraments. We have close on 36 catechists who all do the work on a voluntary basis. This coming year we will be short on catechists so would really appreciate any volunteers.

ALPHA TESTIMONIAL

I have always had a loving relationship with Jesus but I had unanswered questions about the Holy Spirit. Throughout my Alpha journey, the guided small-group conversations about our faith led to asking myself even more questions than receiving answers. But it was through sharing and listening to other people's perspectives that I was able to develop my own faith in a way that I wasn't even aware was possible. I found the Alpha retreat to be the most valuable part of my Alpha journey. I had been experiencing some difficulties in my personal life. I felt trapped and unable to move forward with my struggles, simply surviving as best as I could. During the evening of the Alpha retreat, I recall listening to our host share her experience of being called by the Holy Spirit to help others who were on their Alpha journey. Thankfully, I was sitting in the back row of the room at the time as this enabled me to attempt to disguise the uncontrollable tears which were rolling down my face. I had felt personally touched by the message delivered by our host. It felt as though she was speaking to me. One

person in a crowd of many. We were then led into prayer ministry. After some quiet reflection time, I approached two warm and welcoming parishioners to ask if they would pray for me. At this time, I was still unable to control my streaming tears but shortly after the ladies gently placed their hands on me and begun to pray, I felt still. An immense sense of peace came upon me. It was at that moment that I felt the Holy Spirit was with me and that I had the strength to move forward and conquer my troubles. Months have now passed and I regularly reflect on that time as it was a turning point for me in my life. The Alpha course has touched my life in the most inspiring way. My relationship with Jesus has been strengthened through a feeling which is difficult to express in words. For me, I had to *feel* it to be able to recognise it.

The hidden wisdom of God which we teach in our mysteries is the wisdom that God predestined to be for our glory before the ages began. It is a wisdom that none of the masters of this age have ever known, or they would not have crucified the Lord of Glory; we teach what scripture calls: the things that no eye has seen and no ear has heard, things beyond the mind of man, all that God has prepared for those who love him. These are the very things that God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit reaches the depths of everything, even the depths of God.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Matthew Mt 5:17-37

Such was said to your ancestors; but I am speaking to you.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not imagine that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets. I have come not to abolish them but to complete them. I tell you solemnly, till heaven and earth disappear, not one dot, one little stroke, shall disappear from the Law until its purpose is achieved. Therefore, the man who infringes even one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be considered the least in the kingdom of heaven; but the man who keeps them and teaches them will be considered great in the kingdom of heaven.

'For I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven.

'You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not kill; and if anyone does kill he must answer for it before the court. But I say this to you: anyone who is angry with his brother will answer for it before the court; if a man calls his brother "Fool" he will answer for it before the Sanhedrin; and if a man calls him "Renegade" he will answer for it in hell fire. So then, if you are bringing your offering to the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar, go and be reconciled with your brother first, and then come back and present your offering. Come to terms with your opponent in good time while you are still on the way to the court with him, or he may hand you over to the judge and the judge to the officer, and you will be thrown into prison. I tell you solemnly, you will not get out till you have paid the last penny.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say this to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye should cause you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to have your whole body thrown into hell. And if your right hand should cause you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to have your whole body go to hell.

'It has also been said: Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a writ of dismissal. But I say this to you: everyone who divorces his wife, except for the case of fornication, makes her an adulteress; and anyone who marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

'Again, you have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not break your oath, but must fulfil your oaths to the Lord. But I say this to you: do not swear at all, either by heaven, since that is God's throne; or by the earth, since that is his footstool; or by Jerusalem, since that is the city of the great king. Do not swear by your own head either, since you cannot turn a single hair white or black. All you need say is "Yes" if you mean yes, "No" if you mean no; anything more than this comes from the evil one.'
