Social Justice Corner

World Mental Health Day, 10 October 2022

Mental health and inequality have been two of the biggest conversations in recent years, so 2022's theme for World Mental Health Day – 'make mental health and wellbeing for all a global priority –is fitting. Global inequality and mental health are issues that continuously overlap, throughout society and through the course of individual lives. It is important global efforts are made to ensure mental health is valued, promoted and protected; where everyone has an equal opportunity to enjoy mental health and exercise their human rights; and that everyone can access the mental health care they need.

As Pope Francis reminds us, stigma and discrimination continue to be a barrier to social inclusion and access to the right care. Pope Francis has said we need "to fully overcome the stigma with which mental illness has often been branded to ensure that the culture of community prevails over the mentality of rejection." The Holy Father asks us "to remember our brothers and sisters who suffer from mental illness, and also victims – often young people – of suicide. Let us pray for them and their families, so that they are never left alone, or discriminated against, but instead are welcomed and supported."

Prayer for those Experiencing Mental Illness Loving God, we pray today for those who are confronted by sadness, ambiguity and confusion of mental illness, and for those upon whom they depend for attention and compassionate care.

Look with mercy on all whose afflictions bring them weakness, distress, confusion or isolation.

Provide for them homes of dignity and peace; give them understanding helpers and the willingness to accept help.

We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Word

Sunday 16 October 2022, 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading

From the book of Exodus 17:8-13
As long as Moses kept his arms raised,
Israel had the advantage.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people. The Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 120. R. v.2 (R.) Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

- I lift up my eyes to the mountains: from where shall come my help? My help shall come from the Lord who made heaven and earth. (R.)

Second Reading

From the second letter of St Paul to Timothy 3:14-4:2

This is how the people of God become equipped and ready for every good work. You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy

scriptures – from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy.

This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work. Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke 18:1-8 God will see those who cry to him vindicated. Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death." And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?' The Gospel of the Lord.
