Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

It is reassuring for us to know that in God's artistic work, there is room for a new covenant. The beauty of God's artistry not only includes but uses and transforms the ugly and the dying. This is the point of the wheat grain story. Jesus is the wheat grain, full of the promise of new life, a new way of being. While scripture says that 'being lifted up' indicated the kind of death Jesus would die, it also indicates what is necessary - dying. In Jesus being lifted up from the earth, which could only happen after the wheat grain died, he was showing us how to live in the new covenant.

We must let die all that does not belong to the reign of love and mercy, and we can do this, because our God is a God who 'not only forgives our iniquities but never calls them to mind.' This wheat grain story is such an exceptional teaching you might have to read that last sentence again! Then all will be drawn to Jesus. We will live in him, with the new covenant written deeply in our hearts. We shall be the people of God.

#### PRESBYTERY UPDATE

#### **Dear Parishioners**

Since the last parish update in December last year the Finance Committee has been busy with planning for the new presbytery and office. The plans for the building project have gone through some iterations in order to find the most efficient way of altering the current office premises to transform it into a three bedroom house for our Priests that the Parish can be proud of. The Committee has also discussed the most efficient method for building the new office accommodation.

The current plans are nearly finalised and we envisage that the new office building will now be completely separate from the presbytery. Once these plans are finalised we will meet with representatives of the Diocese to get the final plans approved. It is unlikely that we will need a DA to complete the alterations to the current building but we will need a DA for the new office accommodation. When we receive the Diocesan approval we will provide you with the revised plans and a revised estimate of the building costs.


If we can complete the plans and get the approval from the Diocese within the next month or so we should be able to apply for the DA and request tenders from interested builders within the next six to eight weeks.

The funds raised so far, thanks to the generosity of you, our Parishioners, will enable us to commence the transformation of the current building soon after we receive the tenders from interested builders and appoint a construction firm.

#### Sunday 17 March 2024: Fifth Sunday in Lent

#### Collect

By your help, we beseech you, Lord our God, may we walk eagerly in that same charity with which, out of love for the world, your Son handed himself over to death. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever.

#### **First Reading**

From the prophet Jeremiah Jer 31:31-34

The days are coming when I will make a new covenant with Israel and I will forgive their iniquity. See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks - when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive - it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks - since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 12:20-33

If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest.

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come

for the Son of Man to be glorified.

I tell you most solemnly,

unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain;

but if it dies.

it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him.

Now my soul is troubled.

Father, glorify your name!'
